Mrs. Wood first contracted the incurable disease in 1975, but symptoms were evident in 1972, according to her physician Dr. Donald H. Aikenhead, of Milton.

Dr. Aikenhead is reluctant, however to describe the recovery as a miracle. "What has happened now is part of the disease," he said, adding that relapses interspersed with remissions were not uncommon. "I was very pleased for her, but not surprised." he said.
