Milton entries win at Royal Winter Fair

Milton and district had a good showing of winners at this year's Royal Agricultural Winter Fair with winners in classes ranging from field crops to cattle, horses and pigeons.

The winners included Milton residents, and president of the Fair, Reford Gardhouse. Showing Short-

horn beef cattle, Mr. Gardhouse and his son, Doug, were declared Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder, after competing in 10 classes, placing in seven and winning three of the classes. Doug Gardhouse also received fifth prize in the Herdsman's Award beef cattle class.

An active Halton 4-H member, Holly Hurren captured eighth place in the Holstein Lawara Trophy Awards. Several awards went to Mr. and Mrs. Chris Richardson of Milton for their prize entries of Jersey dairy cattle. The pair placed 10th with their entry, Starbelle BDM Skipper, in the three-year-old female Jersey, eighth with Garnetley Roseboy's Sheila in the five year old female class, and 10th in the inter-bred best udder class.

Campbellville was awarded the Hon. George S. Henry Challenge Trophy for his first prize Holstein breeder's herd. Mr. Wingrove also won three other Holstein classes.

Bertram Stewart of Hornby is a joint owner of Nipponia Fury Need, which topped the bull calf class and went on to win the championship bull award. Other owners are Nipponia Holsteins of Puslinch and Bruno Rosetti, Georgetown.

Clayton Hadfield of Milton won several poultry classes with his selection of Old English Black Bantam, Old English Duckwing and Wyandotte poultry.

In the swine section, Allan A. Cook of R.R. 6, Milton won two awards for Springloom Bonny in the sow section and for a selection of four pigs in the breeder's herd class.

Ken Bailey of Milton won three awards with his Maggie pigeons. Mr. Bailey received a first place and two second place winnings. His son Michael also placed third for his entry, a Chinese owl.

Also showing pigeons from Milton was A.T. Woodley who won a second place in the Red Saddle Fantail section and another second place prize in the Helmet A.O.C. class.

Waterfield Farms of R.R. 5, Milton placed sixth with their entry of Windy Storm in the Registered Canadian Hunter Stallion class. Greek Jab, owned by Sam-Son Farm, R.R. 1, Hornby, placed fifth in the Thoroughbred stallion class. Reserve Junior Champion Standardbred Stallion award went to W. Von Richthofen of Campbellville, for his entry Speed and Win. The entry was also first in the Standardbred colt or gelding foaled in 1976 class.

Mr. and Mrs. Rick Wilcox of Hornby captured several prizes for their showing of Welsh ponies, including the Reserve Championship for junior champion filly. Their entries included Pen-Y-Lane Harmony, Pen-Y-Lane Midax, Silverstone King and Black's Melody.
