

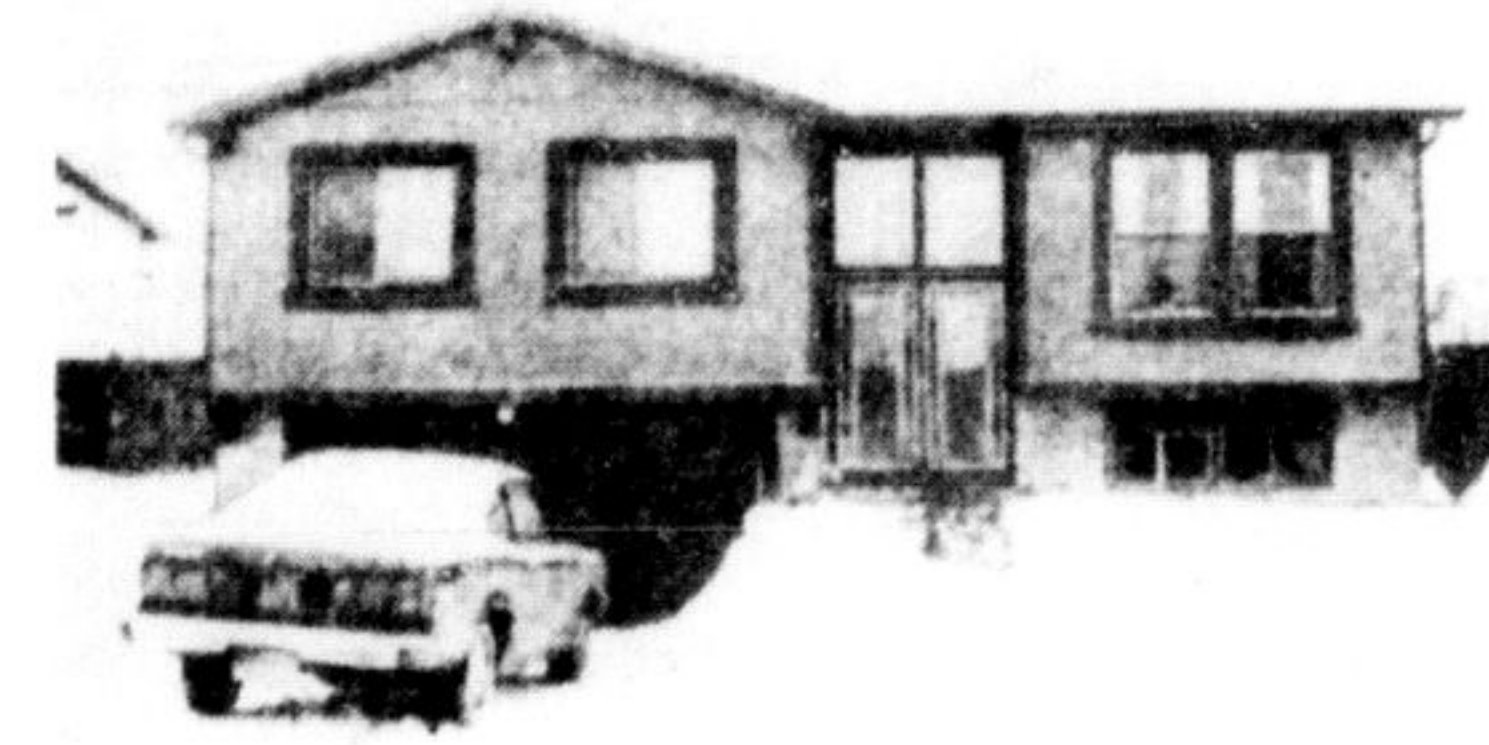
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## Education week on smoking

Community business leaders have good reason to support the National Education Week on Smoking, said Miss Evelyn Hartwell, Past President of the Oakville Chamber of Commerce. The non-smoking week is taking place across Canada, Jan. 22-28, 1978, sponsored by the Canadian Council on Smoking and Health.

The theme for the week is Join the Majority - Be a non-smoker. It's a fact, points out Miss Hartwell, more Canadians are non-smokers than smokers, so we are urging the smokers to make a real attempt to join the majority.

Miss Hartwell explained that hundreds of thousands of working hours are lost by persons suffering from smoking related disease. In addition, she said, approximately one-third of fire property loss is caused by cigarette smokers.

Damage to the Callan vehicle is estimated at \$35 and \$200 for the Hayward car.

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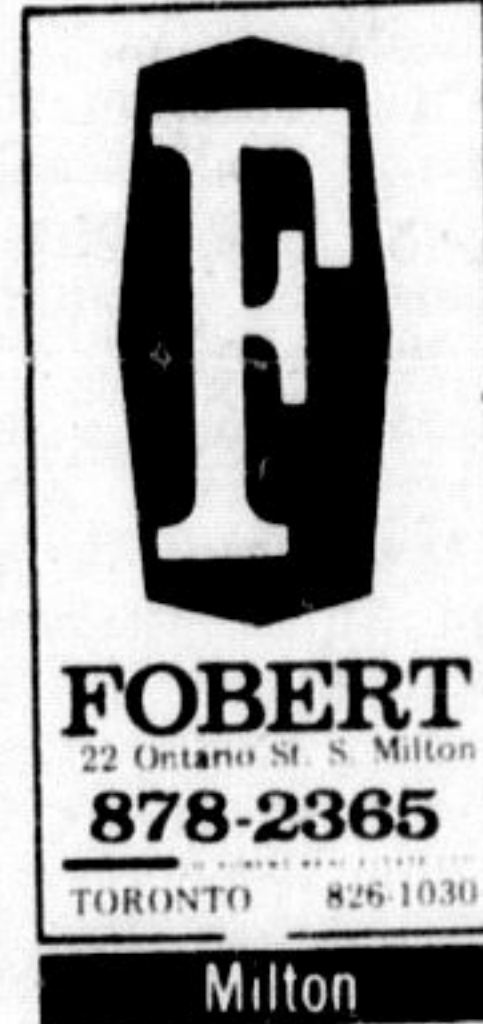
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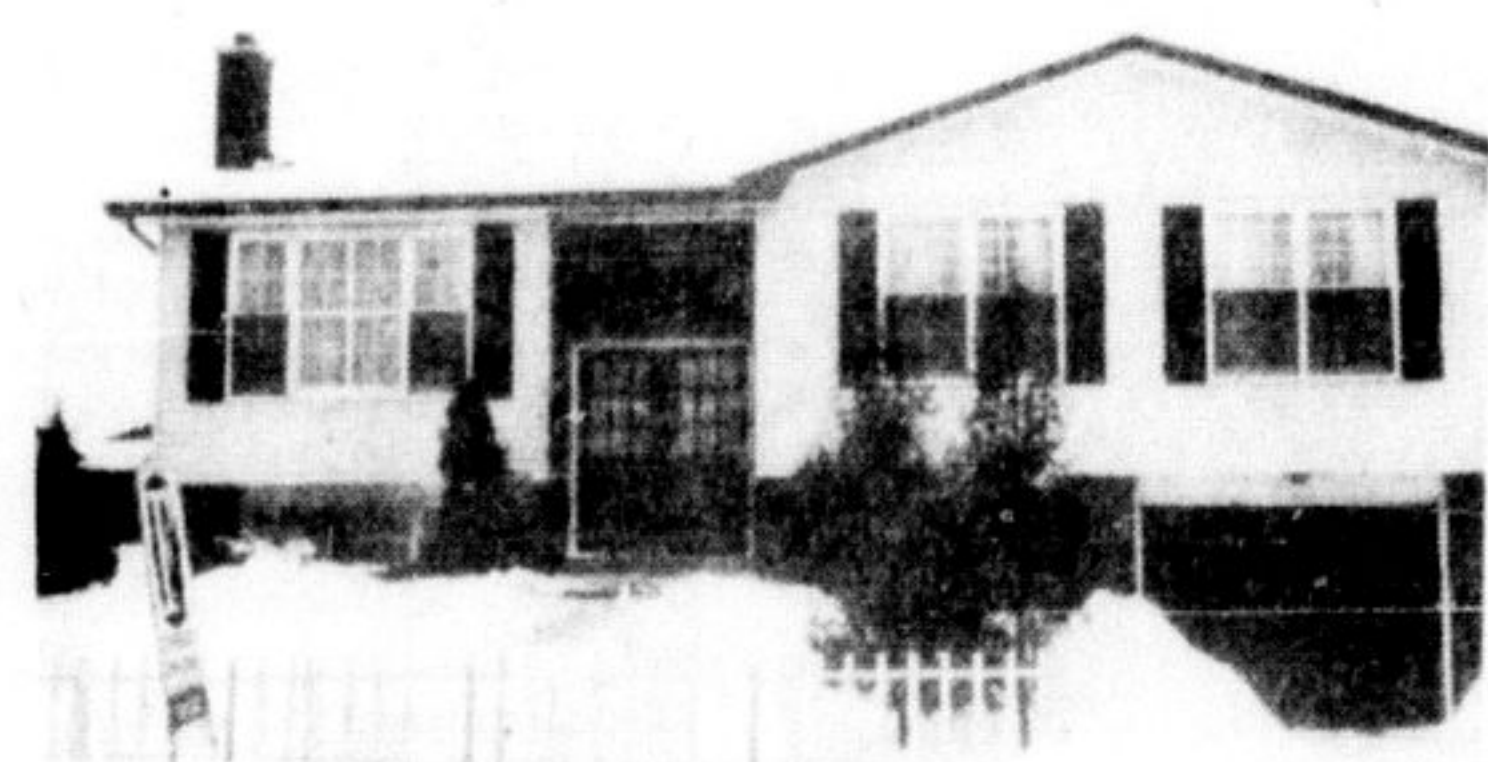

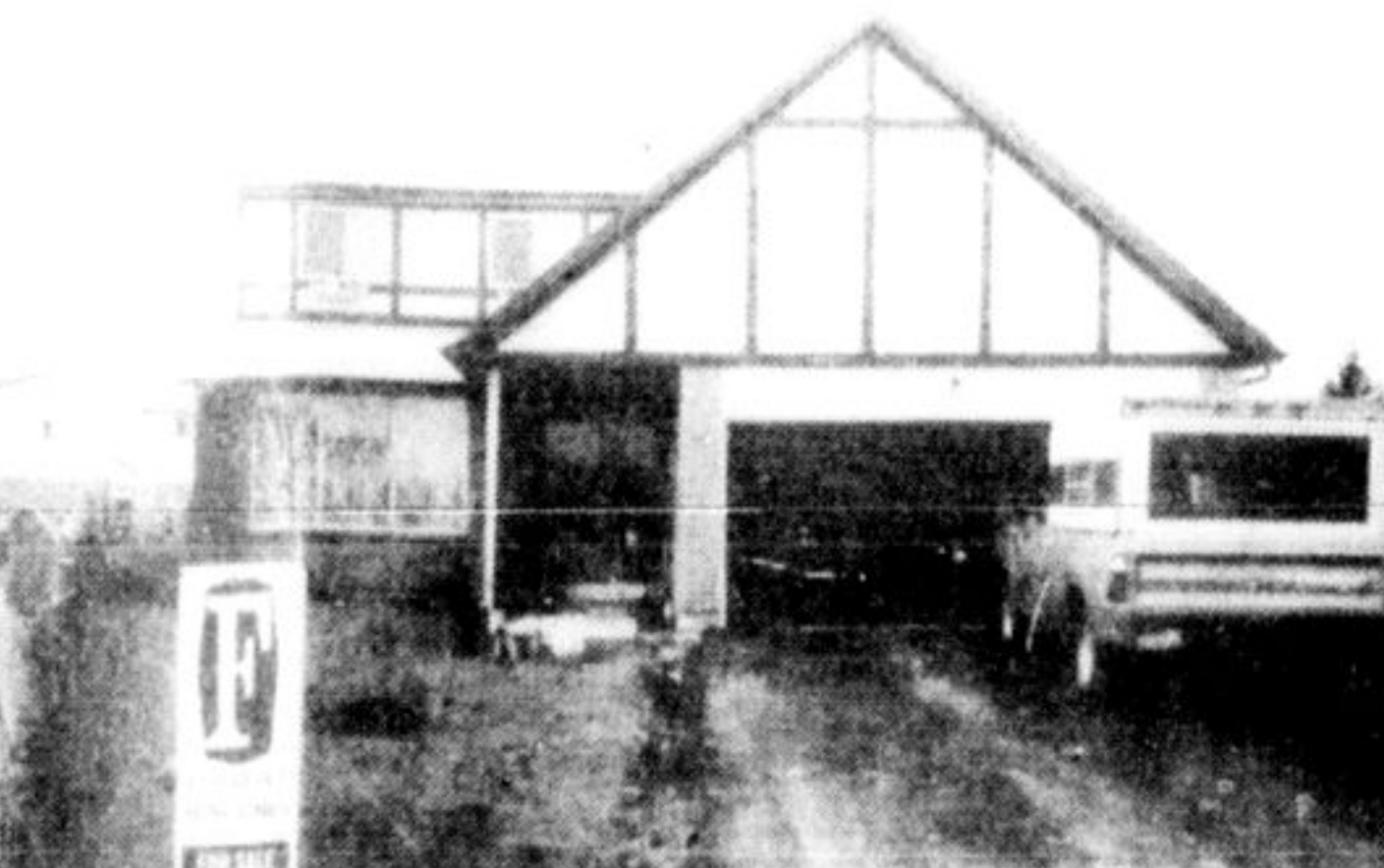
