Portables stay at Baldwin even after major addition

Even with the completion of \$300,000, eight-room addition to Robert Baldwin School, the school will be forced to rely on the use of portable classrooms to allev-

iate crowded conditions. The school enrolment now stands at 593 and is expected to climb to 640 in September, according to vice-principal Colton Roberts.

The school now has seven portable classrooms. The addition will move all but one classroom of students into the main school this year. If the projections are correct three portables will be required in September.

Approximately 100 students who are now being bused to Pineview will attend Robert Baldwin and the school is also increased expecting an

kindergarten enrolment. "We had 89 kindergarten children this year," said Mr. adding projected figures indicate more than 100 will attend for the 1978-'79 year.

The student increase would have been even greater, but for the fact that two grade six classes will be transferred to Martin St. Middle School in Baldwin will continue with kindergarten to grade five

The school was built three and a half years ago and immediately filled to capacity. Located in a major growth centre of the town, the heavy enrolment unusual, according to Donna Robbins, secretary at Robert Baldwin School. "In any new area such as Milton, there is always a great number of little children in the beginning and there is inevitable overcrowding."

"Within 10 to 15 years however, the numbers decrease and often schools will become half-filled," she said, adding that "it is not feasible to make the addition larger."




