Over 500 Milton youths select soccer this year

Over 500 boys and girls are into soccer. That's what the Milton Youth Soccer Association registrations number after Saturday's session at the Milton Mall.

There will be 30 boys' teams and five girls' teams taking to the pitches this summer, which is a 25 per cent increase over last year's figures.

Chief registrar for the MYSC, John Morgan, told The Champion, "We're interested in getting kids out to play," and said they are still accepting late registrations and there is no penalty fee involved.

"It is not difficult to place a child on a team and we can always accommodate the extra players, particularly girls. A lot of girls don't realize there is going to be a girls' operation this year," he said.

Morgan said at a MYSA coaches' meeting Monday evening that the aim of the MTSC is to provide the best possible soccer for the Milton youth. He pointed out many boys and girls have been out for the winter and spring conditioning programs for eight weeks and the numbers are growing.

He said there were some problems last year in setting up the representative teams but this year the MYSC is following a new approach. All the boys and girls have been assigned to teams and there is an average of 16-19 players per team.

The rep team tryout games will be staged and Milton rep coaches will be selecting their teams from these tryout games.

The rest of the teams will be balanced after the rep players are selected from the house league group.

There are 54 children out to J. M. Denyes gymnasium under Brian Scragg and Steve Griffin on Thursday evening. Two schools will now be used for the program.

Children six to 12-years-old will be at Denyes and those 13 and up will be at Milton District High School with Steve Griffin from 6.30 p.m. 'til 8 p.m. The older girls will also go to the high school.
