# Milton Youth Soccer coach meeting packed

There was no coaches meeting last year, but there were not enough chairs to go around at the Rotary Park meeting hall Monday night when the Milton Youth Soccer Club held its first coaches meeting.

MYSA head coach Brian Scragg chaired the meeting and Hardy Japp of the Oakville Youth Soccer Club was on hand to inform prospective coaches there will be a coaches clinic run on two weekends for those interested in developing or upgrading their skills.

"You should get something out of soccer," Japp said. He said his club seemed to be losing the coaches in the older age groups and they realized they needed the clinic three years ago.

He invited the Milton coaches to attend the Oakville Soccer Club's clinics which are held on Sunday at White Oaks High School from 10 a.m. to noon for younger groups and from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. for older groups.

A local coaches clinic may be instructed by qualified personnel from the Ontario Youth Soccer Association for a \$5 per person fee. A local group will have to organize the people and facilities for the OYSA clinics.

The coaches meetings will be held on the first Monday of each month starting at 7:30 p.m. This year the coaches will be handed two balls, uniform kits, a MYSC Handbook, a first aid box, and a pump for the balls. The MYSC Handbook could be the most promising piece of equipment adopted and used by the Milton Soccer club in their brief history.

Other discussions fell on pitches which will be used this year and the setting up of a discipline committee.

The discipline committee is chaired by Brian Scragg of the coaches and will include a representative of the MYSC, a coach of any level, the two offending coaches and the boy if over mosquito age.

The discipline forms must be executed by the referee in charge of the game within three days of the dispute or infraction. In seven days a meeting will be set by the discipline committee.

The purpose of the committee is to discourage fighting on the soccer field. Warnings and suspension are set down by the committee.

Of course the referee still has the two yellow warning cards and the red expulsion from play card at his use but the discipline report forms would be used for incidents of a more serious nature.
