## Manpower opens office

Milton's Student Manpower placement office was officially opened Friday morning. The opening marked the eighth year the post office building office has been used to help local high school and postgraduate students find jobs. Manpower officials present at the opening expressed optimism for Milton students. Fifteen local jobs have already been filled during the last month, according to

Wendy Coulson, placement officer with the student office. The office received 32 job orders by the end of April from local employers, she stated, and added the Manpower office has received 200 student registrations to date. Last year's figures for job placement showed a 98 per cent efficiency rate, according to Debra Perris, Manpower official, who stated all jobs with the exception of a small percentage were filled.

It took nearly 200 students to fill one cherry picking job order alone, stated Evelyn Hartwell, manager of Oakville and area Canada Employment Office.

Manpower officials began their canvass for summer jobs in April and will continue to visit prospective Milton employers throughout the summer.

June represents the best month for students and employers, said Mrs. Perris, "because students are finished with school and employers by then know what they need for summer help."

Present for the official opening were Maria Reis, president of the Milton Chamber of Commerce, Joyce Hagevik, secretary with the Chamber of Commerce, Milton Mayor Don Gordon, Jack Woolfrey from the Halton Board of Education, Pat Foster from Milton District High School and a number of representatives from Employment and Immigration Department.

The student office will be open weekdays 8:15 a.m. until 4:15 p.m. until Labor Day weekend in September.
