

— Graduation time for schools — Stewarttown graduates 235

Two hundred and thirty-five grade eight pupils from Stewarttown senior public school graduated June 1 in a sweltering ceremony at Georgetown and district high school. An overflow crowd of about 650 parents, relatives and friends attended.

"The kids looked forward to it," said Gord Bassett, master of ceremonies and a social science teacher at the school. "They worked hard." He described the ceremony as "... like a bow being put on a package that's not been closed for two years."

In September, the graduating students—10 fewer than last year—will be going to high schools in Georgetown, Acton, Milton, Oakville and Burlington.

Diplomas were presented to the seven graduating classes and awards to 19 students.

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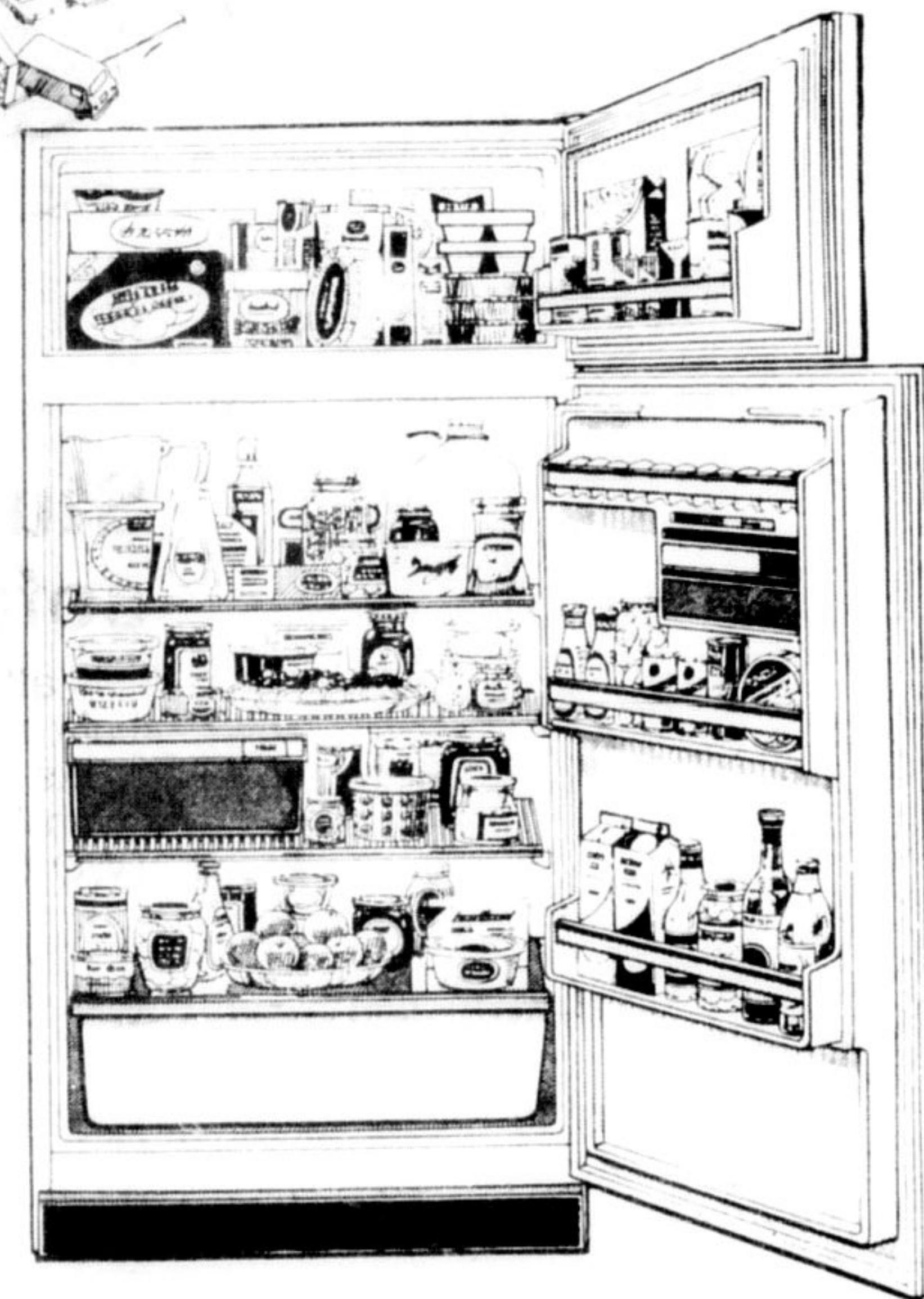


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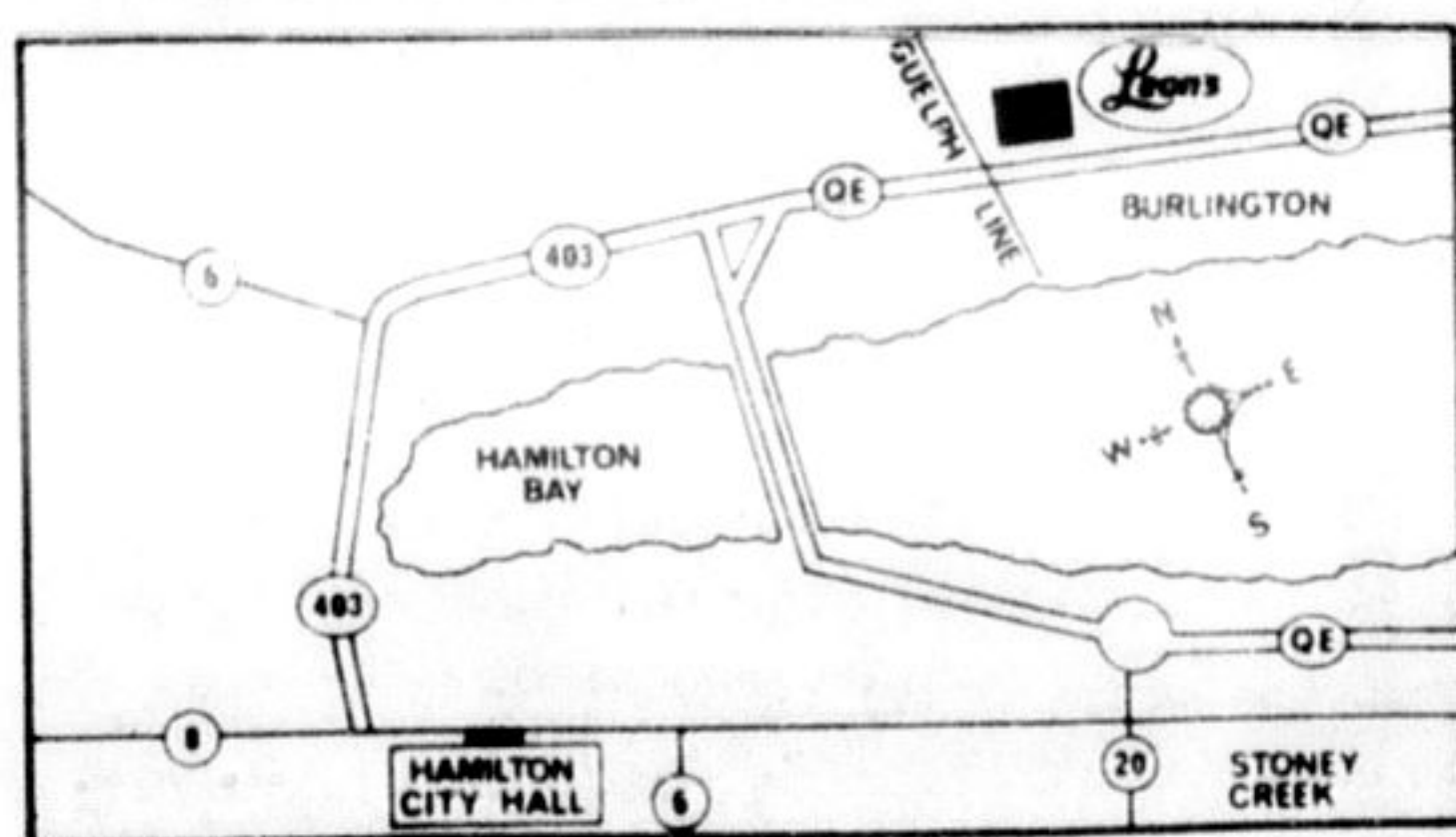
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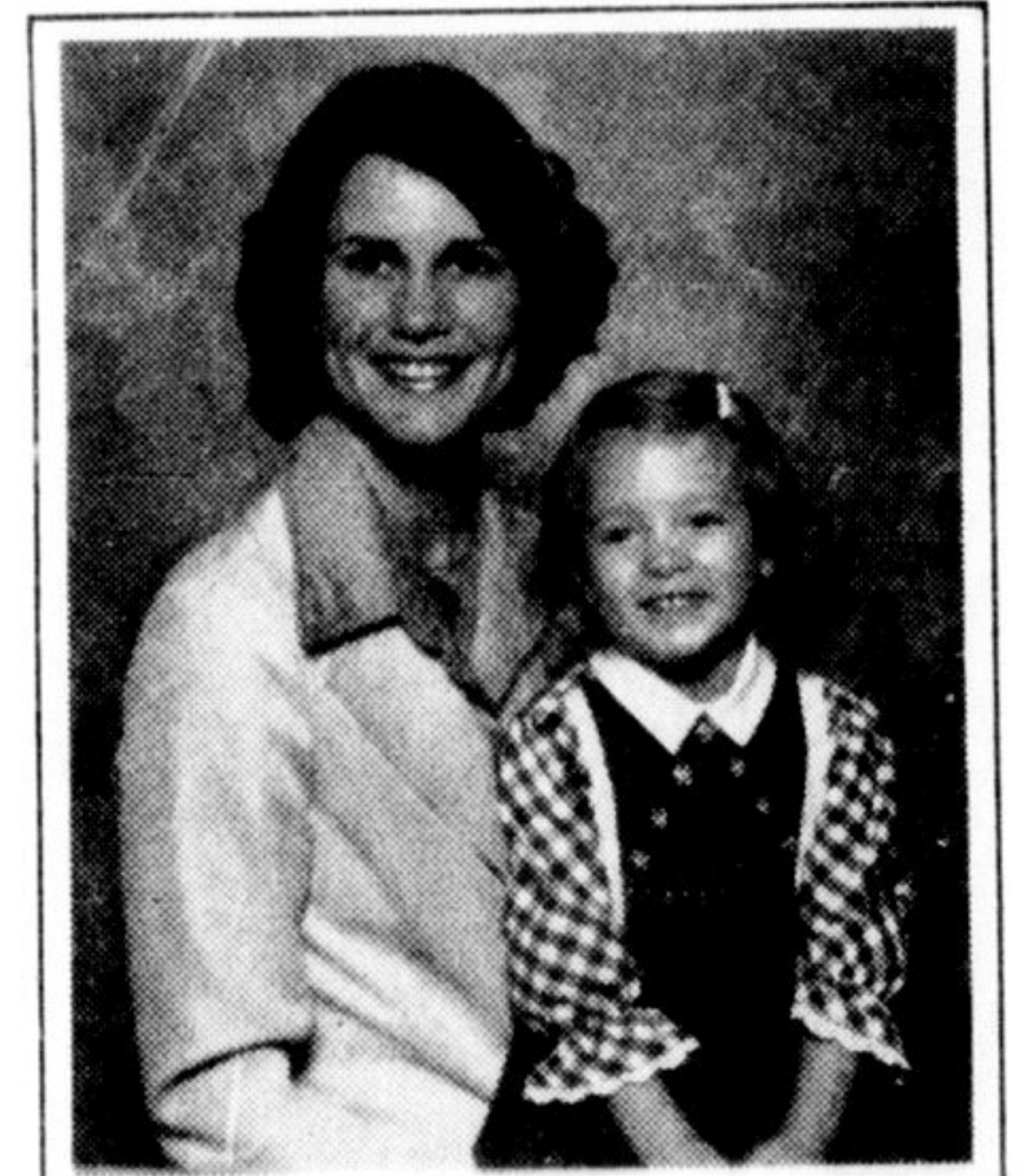
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
