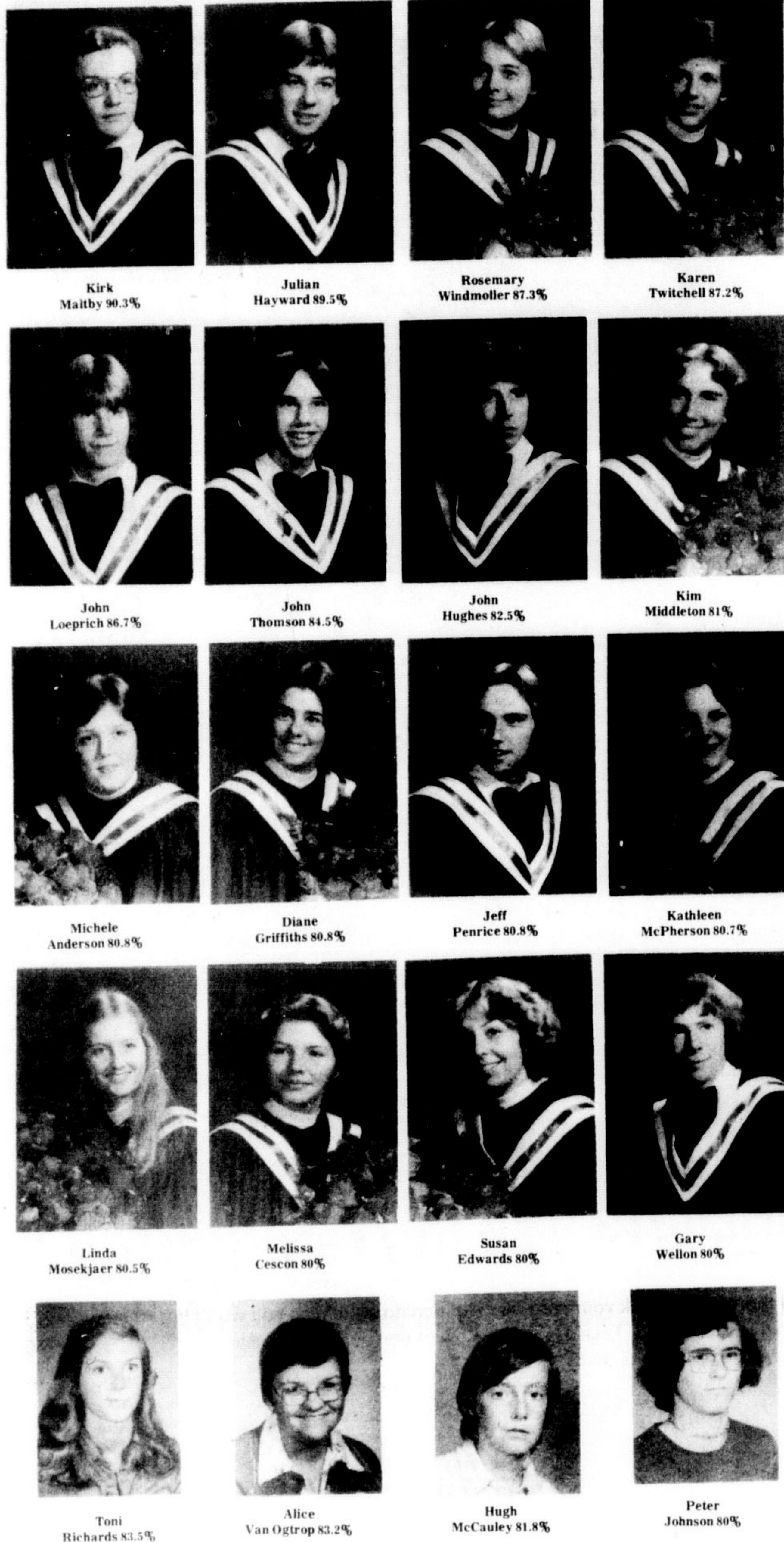

Police morale report

Coons, Commission take hard line

The pot called the kettle black and the kettle replied in and outside a Halton Regional Police Commission meeting at Oakville, Thursday.

The pot—Commissioner David Coons—and the kettle—Police Association chief Al Ruelens—pointed to the soot on each other on the subject of the Halton Regional Police Association's controversial morale report.

Coons, in the first commission meeting since release of the 61-page report to commission and press, said it was his opinion the report had done serious damage. Coons made it plain from the beginning that he was speaking only for himself and not stating commission policy.

Oakville commissioner Harry Barrett said after hearing Coons' remarks he

agreed with them. No commissioners objected.

Glenn Magnuson, from Georgetown, was absent from the meeting because he was on holidays, according to Barrett.

About five association members were with Ruelens at the meeting.

After Coons unloaded his remarks, the commission went into camera. Association heads huddled in a cafeteria adjoining the commission meeting room, then invited the press in to hear their answers.

First Coons.

"You," he said to Ruelens, "violated a moral code." Coons, from Burlington, said he recalled clearly a commitment from Ruelens where he would sit with the commission and discuss the report.

Not so Ruelens told reporters. We (the association) said the report was coming—and that was it. There was no talk of going into camera, he said.

Then Ruelens took the offensive. "We didn't break faith with anyone." He said the commission broke faith when it advertised in newspapers for jobs before posting them within the force, as is the policy.

Nowhere in the report does it praise this commission, not that the commission looks for praise, said the Burlington commissioner, also the newest commissioner.

In the last year the force has come along way in terms of administration, said Coons. "I think the chief (Ken Skerrett) is much happier because
