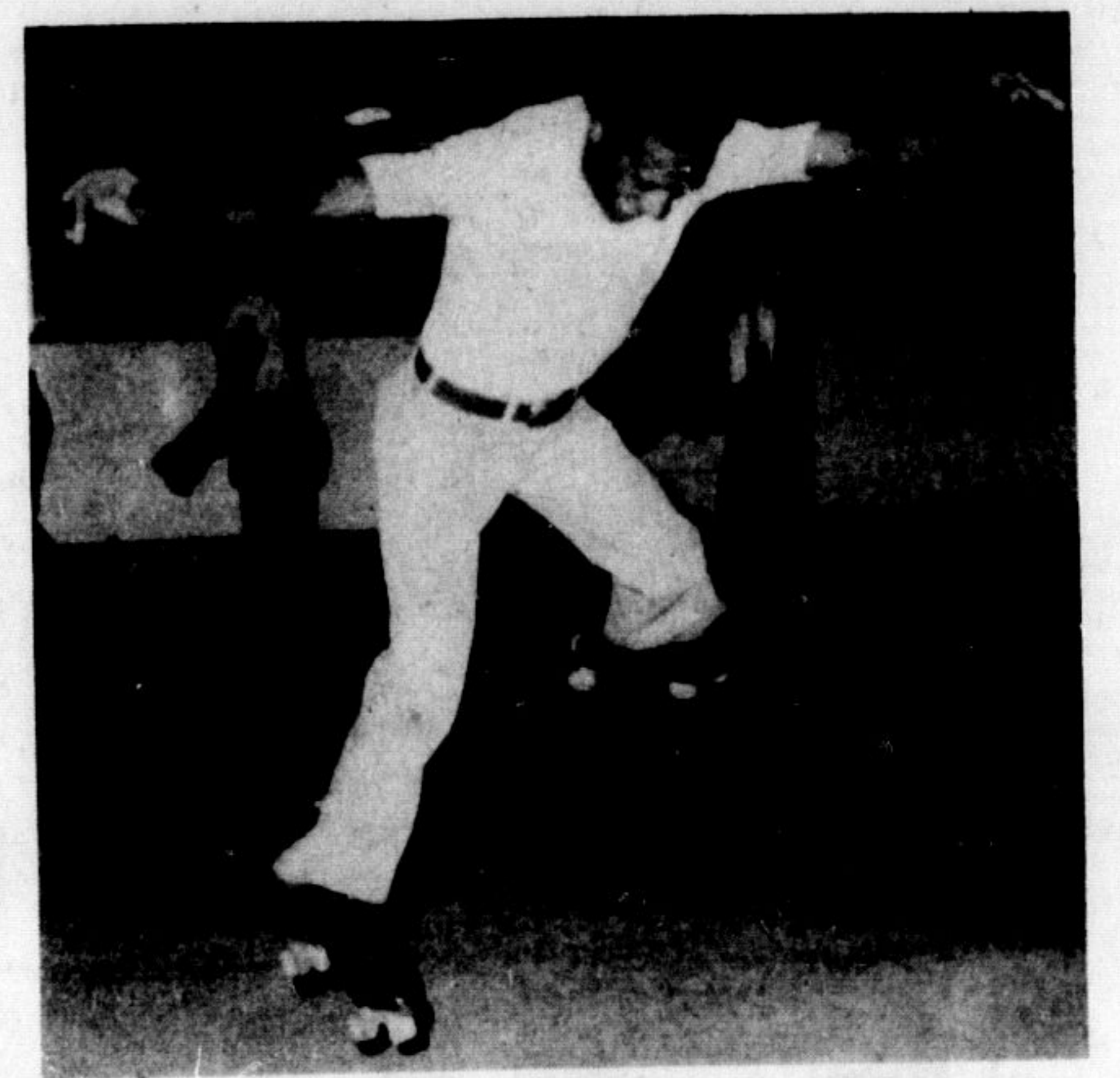

EVERYBODY SEEMS to have a stunt or trick they like to do in front of a camera, like this sit-down artist.

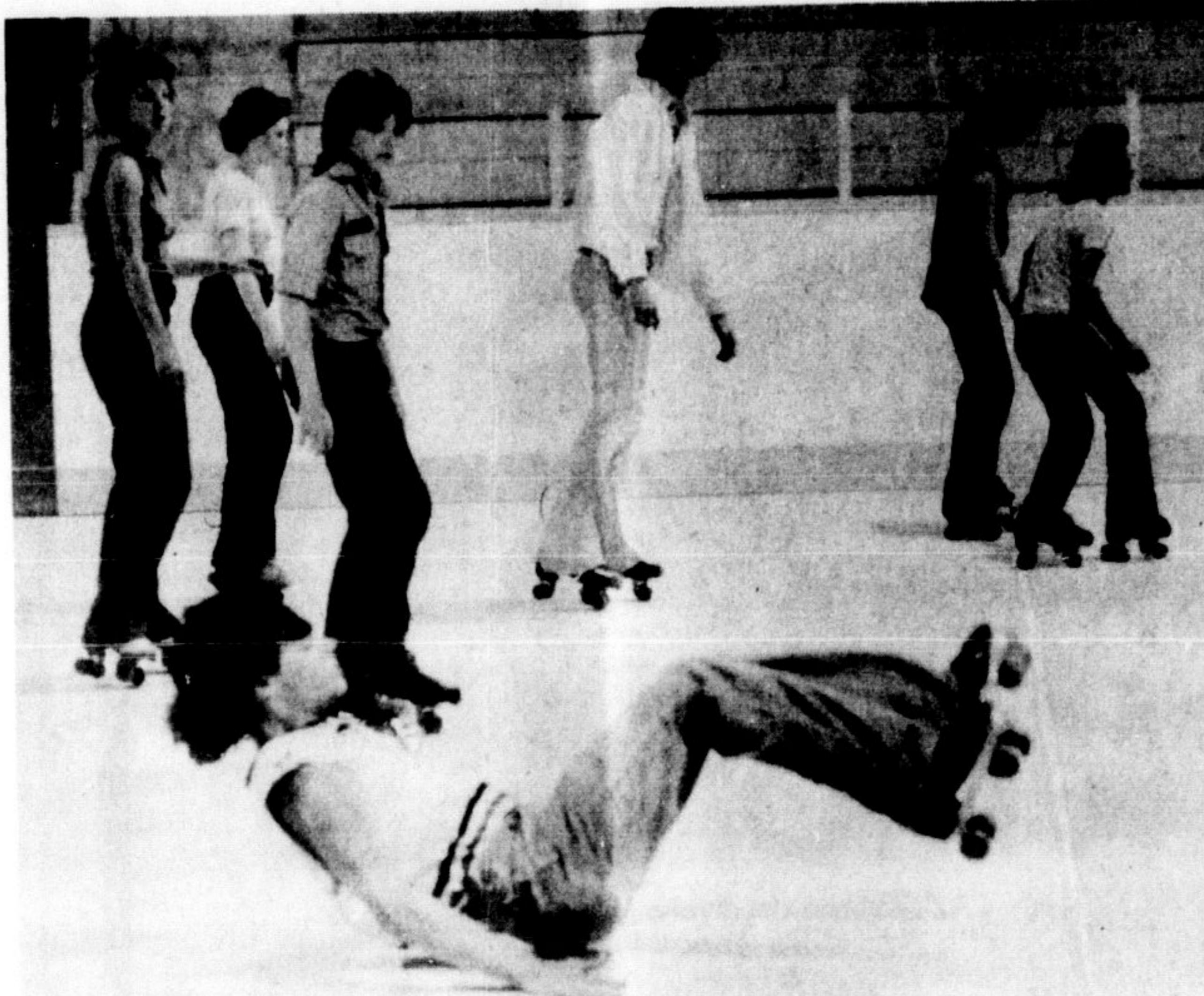

Experience '78 crews work for Authority

"They're learning and earning..."
Forty-two students are employed with Halton Region Conservation Authority this summer under the Ontario government's Experience '78 program. Students are working in four main areas: construction, water control, forestry and park maintenance and patrol.
Anthony Tonelli of Campbellville, is helping to build a 60-foot stone wall at Mountsberg with the construction crew.
"It's great experience," said Tonelli. "I like working outside."
The water control crew is responsible for reservoir maintenance at Hilton Falls, Mountsberg and Kelso Conservation areas. Students in the forestry crew are thinning trees and assisting in nursery work.
Members of the park maintenance and patrol clean up the Authority parks and are also picking up debris from streams in Oakville and Burlington.
In addition to the four main groups, two students are in the painting and graphic design program, two students are gaining secretarial experience and one is a mechanic's assistant. On the road and survey program, two students are estimating repaving costs for Authority roads.
"It's a really good experience to get out and work for conservation," said Shelley Culin, 16, of Waterdown. Shelley is part of the park maintenance and patrol crew.
