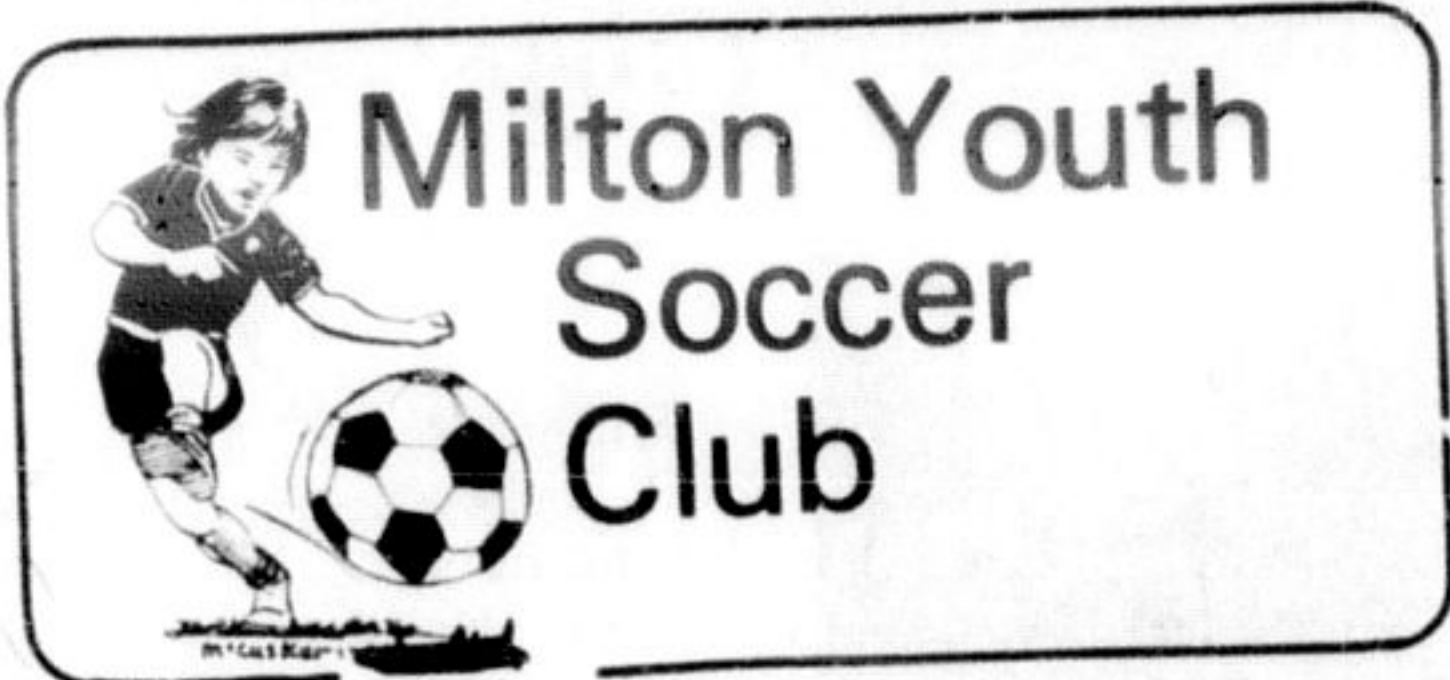

The one goal that beat Hartman was a sure shot on which he had no chance to make a save. It was his first game in goal.

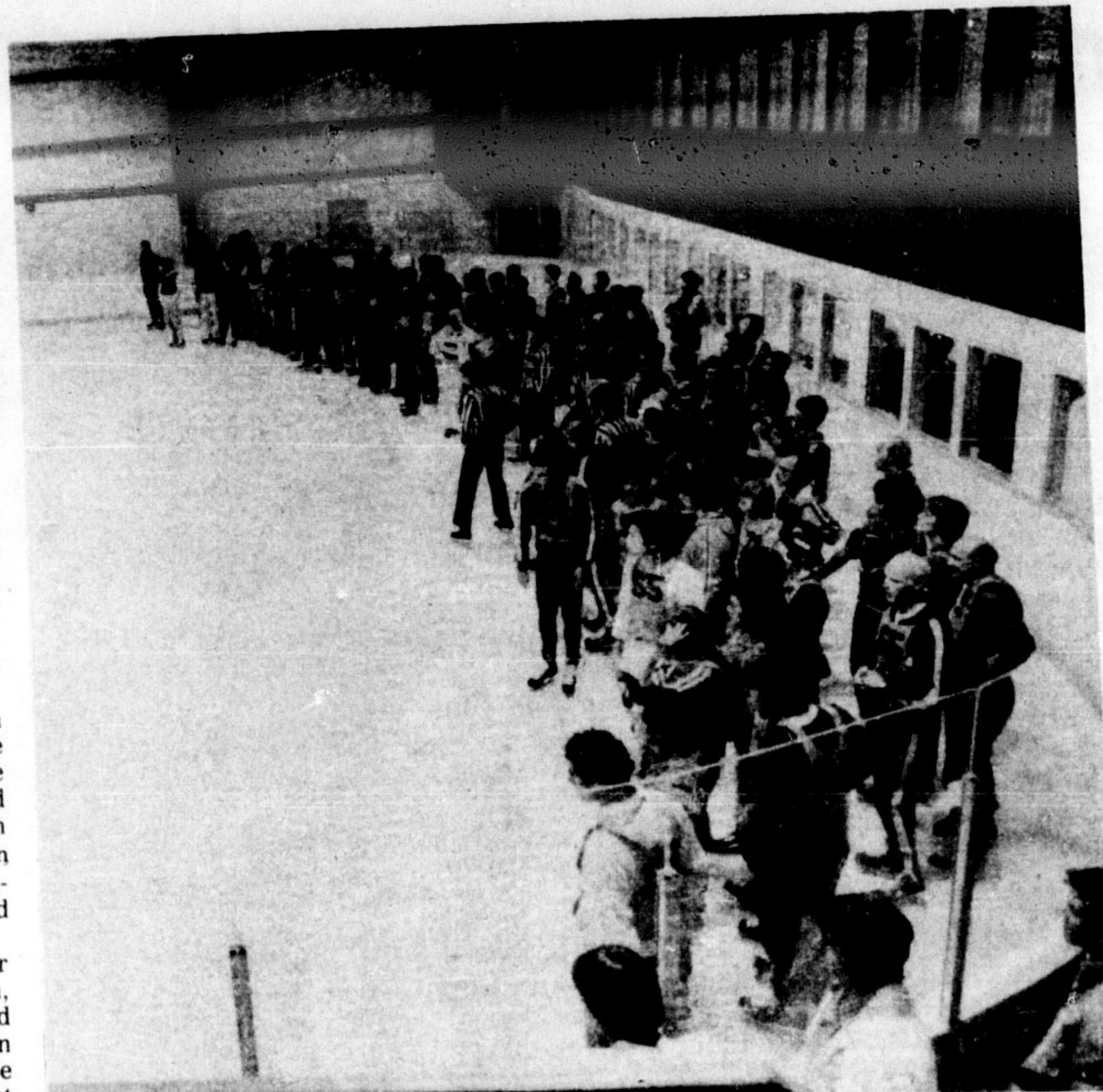
Wayne Wyckoff scored two goals for Milton, one in each half. Two other goals tallied in the first half came off the

The meeting is being held to discuss do's and don'ts for the upcoming playoffs.

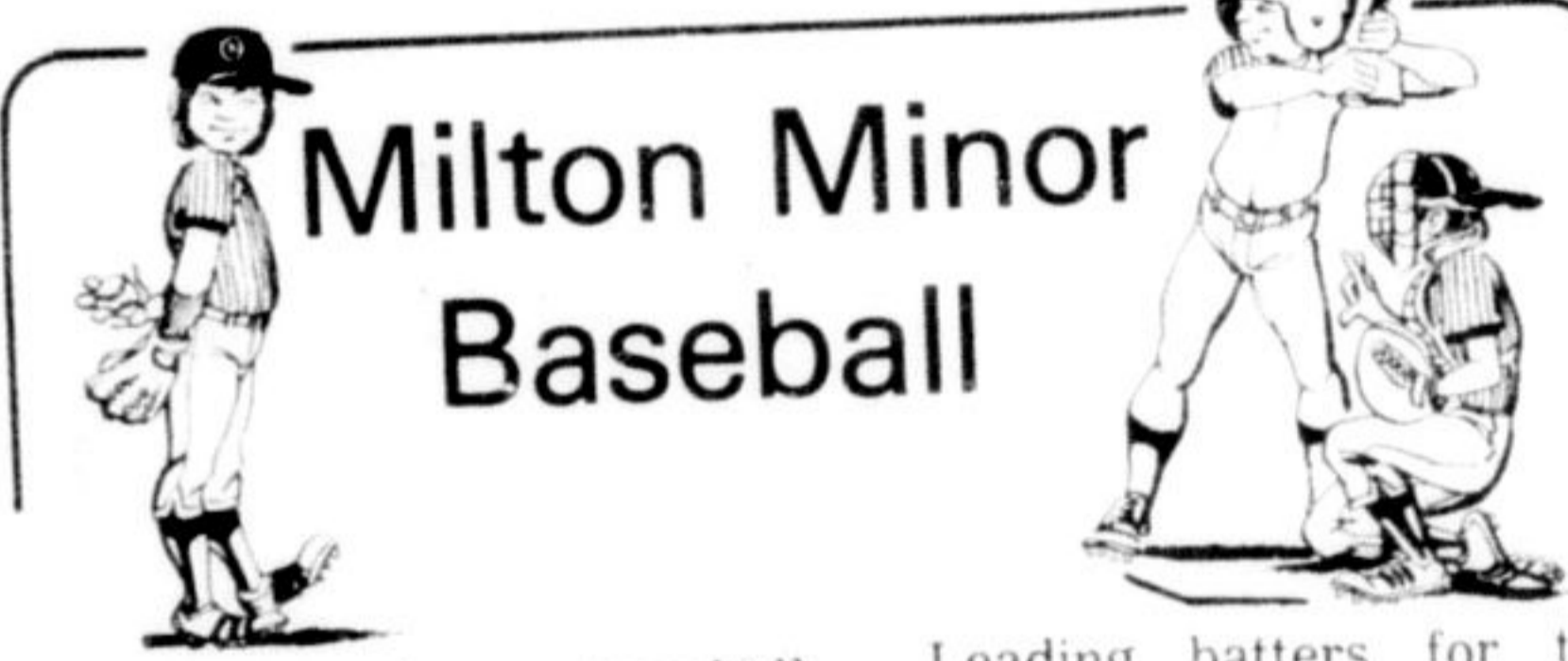

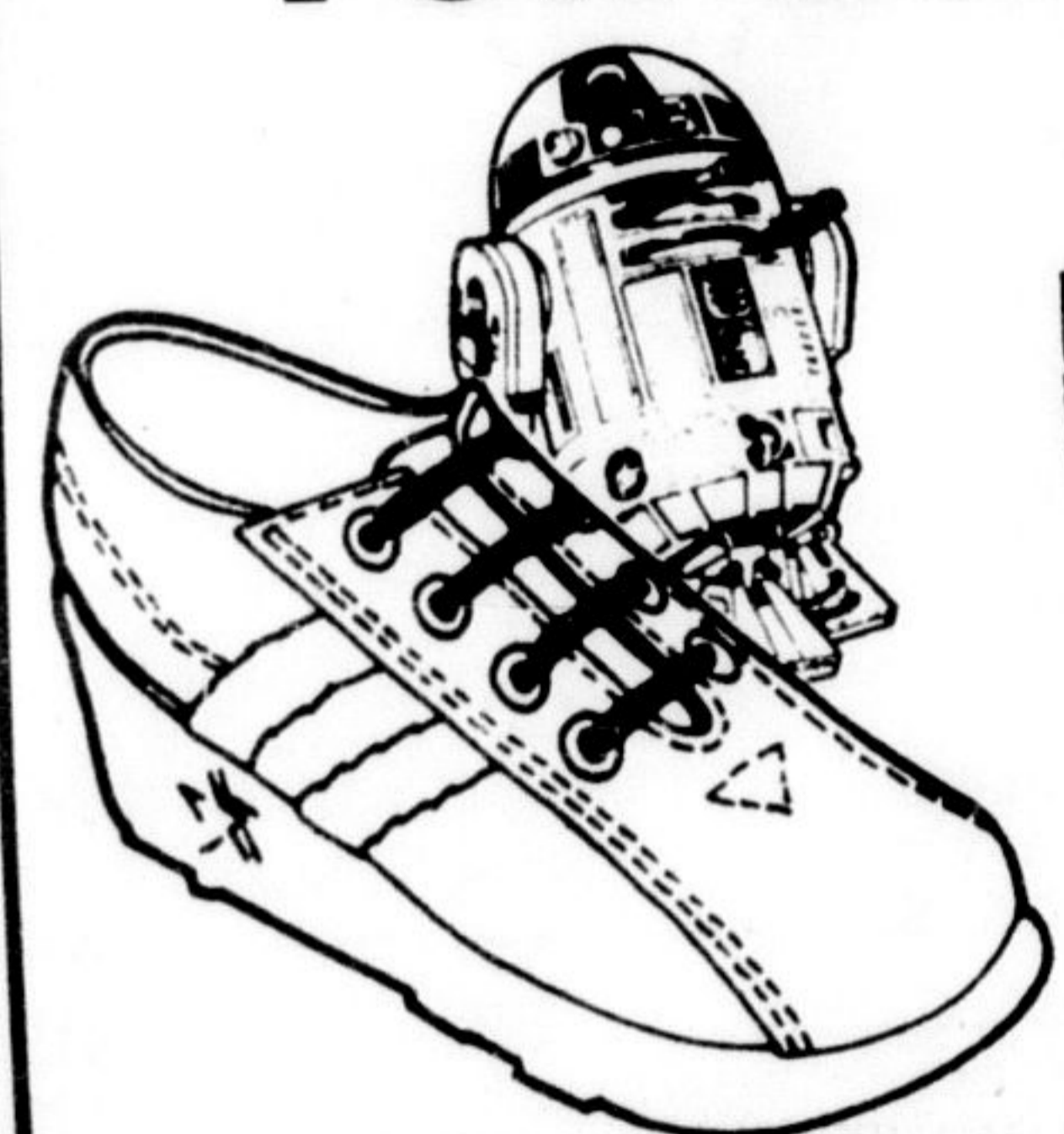
