## Eight Halton steers enter Queen's Guineas

Eight Halton 4-H members have been nominated to enter the 1978 Queen's Guineas Class at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, being held in Toronto Nov. 9-18.

Youth Day at this year's 50th Royal is Nov. 9 and a record number (465) have entered the Queen's Guineas class from 25 counties and regions in Ontario.

Halton entrants are Doug Donaldson and Joyce Parker, Campbellville; Nancy McKinnon and Bill Wartlick, Milton; David Lasby, Rockwood; and Paul Wilkinson, Beaverington and Brian Wingfield, Georgetown.

Judge is Andy Brown of Lethbridge, Alta. Contestants will compete in eight breed

classes, starting at 8 a.m. An auction will be held at 2 p.m. and both activities are open to the public.

Steers entered must have made an average daily gain of at least two pounds during the five month period, May 15 to Oct. 15 and a minimum weight of 1,250 pounds is preferred. A county culling com-

mittee will check the entries in early October and steers that do not meet the standards will not be allowed to enter.

The Queen's Guineas prize (\$250) comes from a fund started in 1861 by King Edward VII, then Prince of Wales, set up for the development of agriculture in Ontario. The fund is administered by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food. The Guineas prize goes to the grand champion steer in the contest and in addition, the exhibitor of the champion steer in each of the other seven classes will receive \$100.

yearling bull class was Romandale Count Review. This son of Romandale Count Crystan, exhibited by Romandale Farms Ltd., Unionville was declared champion male over Moore and Stewart's first prize bull calf Spring Hedge Phoenix, a son of Puget Sound Highmark.

The first prize four-year-old was Allangrove Unique Mary for owner M. D. Wingrove, Campbellville. There were two Ontario district herds shown. West-Central won first with East-Central runner-up.

## Antique tractor class at Peel plowing match

An antique tractor and steam engine class will be a special feature of the Peel Plowing Match, to be held Monday, Sept. 18 at the farm of Alex McKinney, L.14, Conc. 2 W, Brampton.

Organizers offer cash prizes for plowing done by antique tractors or steam engines. The equipment must be at least 40 years old. Plowing starts at 11 a.m. and prizes of \$35, \$30 and \$25 are offered the first three finishers, with \$15 going to each entry.

There is also a class for the best restored equipment, with \$35 and \$25 prizes for the top two. Director Jim Eccles is in charge of the competition.

There are nine classes for horse-drawn or tractor plows in the Peel match this year, plus a special class for business and professional people and a Queen of the Furrow contest.

A banquet will follow the day's plowing, at the Campbell's Cross Hall.

The McKinney farm is just west of Highway 10 and north of Highway 7.

## Outdoor farm show

Astronaut Neil Armstrong, first man on the moon, will officially open the 1978 International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show in Huron County, Sept. 26.

The largest outdoor farm machinery show in Canada will be held one mile east of Wingham, until Sept. 30. A panorama of striped marquees, trailers, booths, and furrowed fields will await more than 200,000 visitors. The 1,000-acre site will contain a tented city, parking facilities, and plots for plowing competitions.

"This will be the biggest match ever, since its beginning in 1913", say E.A. Starr, director of the Agricultural and Horticultural Societies Branch, Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food. "More than 500 exhibitors are expected, making seven streets necessary in the tented city. Every exhibit will be a special attraction."

The city of tents will awe visitors with rows of new farm machinery, exhibits and food concessions.

Entertainment and education will be provided for all ages. Children will enjoy candy treats and rides. Parades will feature ox-teams, floats, steam engines, model cars and bands.

Fashion shows, cooking lessons, cake decorating, and flower arranging are planned for women.

The match is famed for demonstrations of horse-plowing. Besides catching a glimpse of old-fashioned rural Ontario, visitors will see modern equipment turning the sod.

Two hundred contestants, including plowmen from overseas, will test their plowing skills for \$35,000 prize money. Special classes will be held for visiting dignitaries and media personalities.
