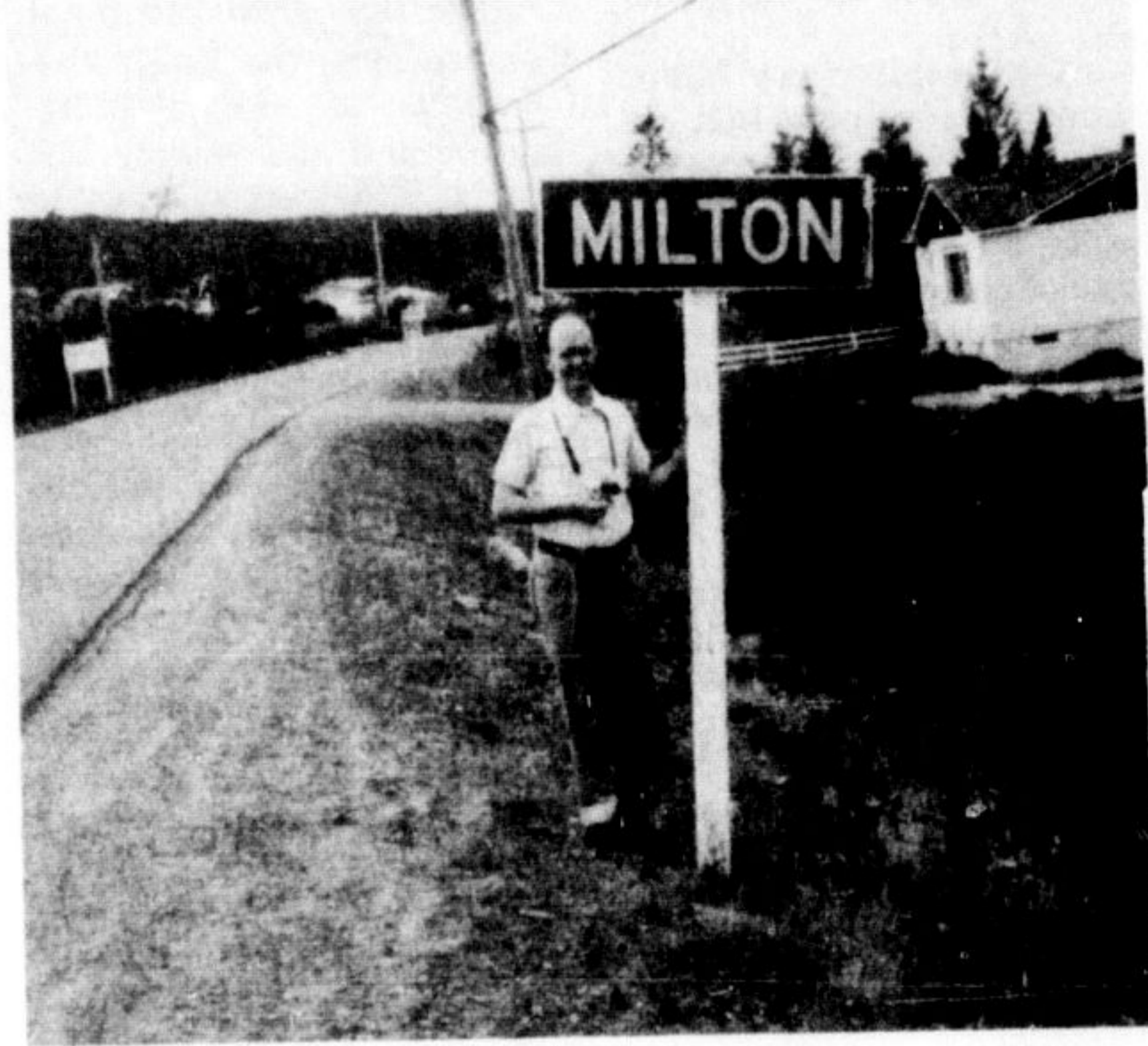


All about / People

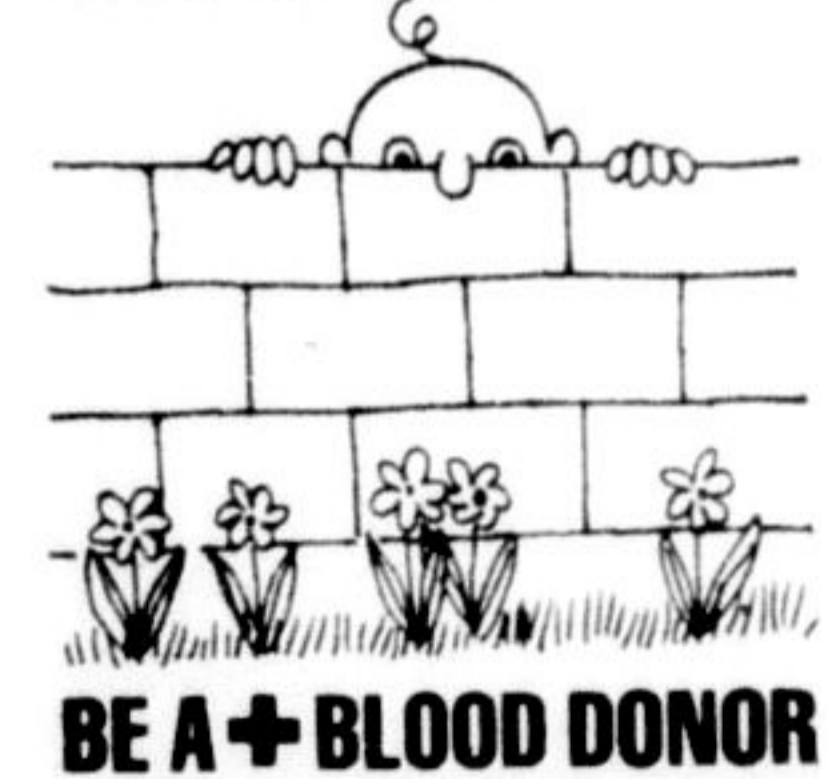
The second time Jelinek blushed, was when the interviewer asked if his sister Maria had really become so angry with him during one of their figure skating performances that she hit him.
