

New minister at Kilbride

Church responding to 'inner needs'

Rev. Alfred McAlister is the new minister of Carlisle and Kilbride United Church congregations, but his name is not entirely new to the community.

More than 120 years ago, the minister's great-grandfather was a Methodist minister of a Kilbride church, and his grandfather also served as a Methodist minister in Kilbride in later years.

Rev. McAlister comes to

the community after serving as a minister in Thornhill for eight years.

A native of London, Ontario, the 50-year-old minister admits the move to the rural community will mean significant changes for him and his family.

Accustomed to living in a large urban district of Toronto, with a congregation of approximately 750 families, his new appointment is a complete change.

He will serve nearly 300 families in Kilbride and Carlisle as United Church minister in the community.

"It is a different pace of life here, but it is also a very stimulating and inspiring congregation in this area," said the new minister who preached his first sermon on Sunday, Sept. 3.

His induction into the new church was held during a special service Sunday

evening at Carlisle Church. It will still take some time however, before the new minister is familiar with both of his congregations and the area.

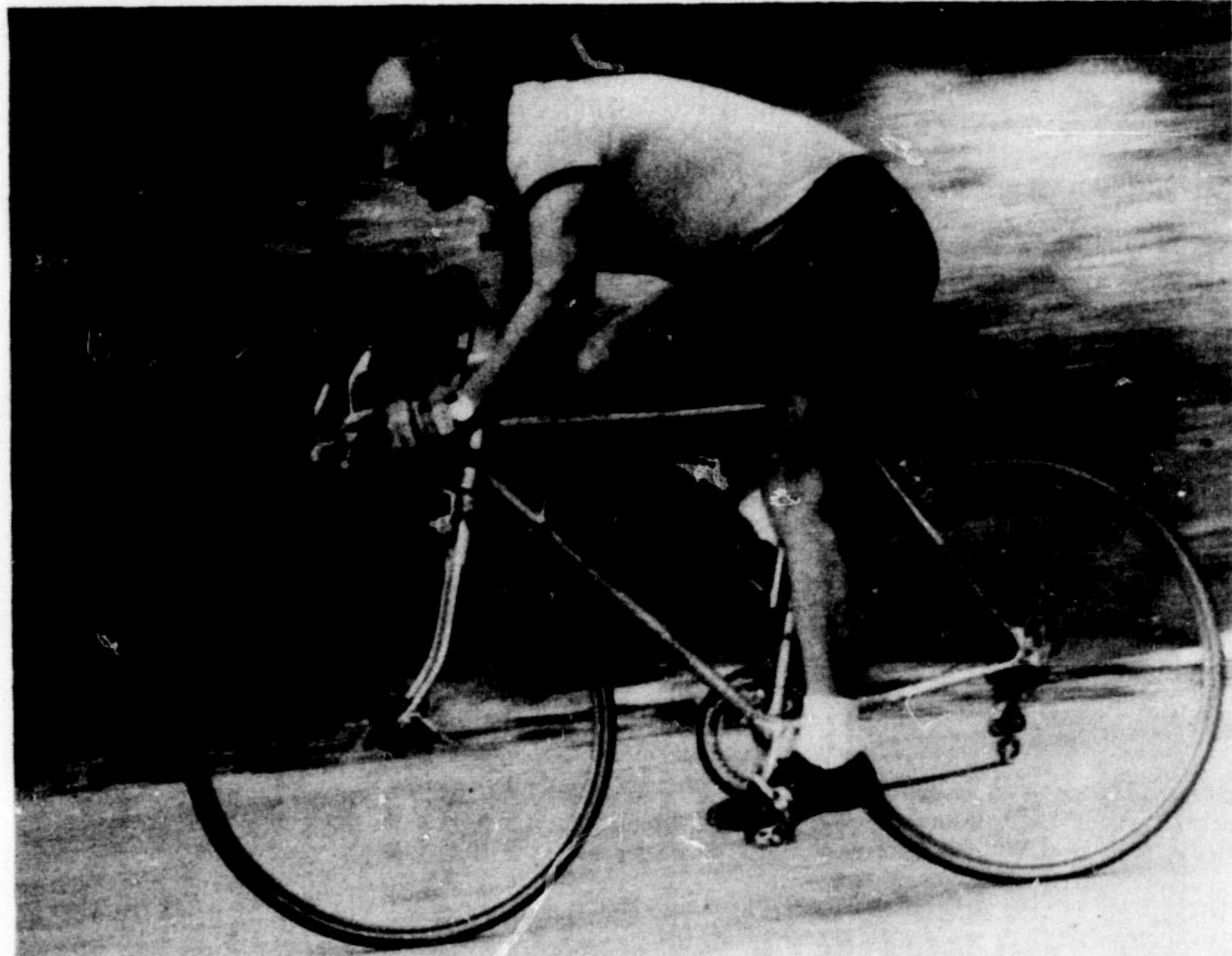
"It is going to be a challenge," he said of his new position, adding that he felt he had a lot to learn from the people and wanted to get to know his congregation well, before establishing new extra church activities.

"They are a very active congregation," he noted appreciatively, pointing out that the church has already established itself as a centre for a number of children, youth and adult programs.

Although Rev. McAlister has not at this time decided to what extent he will become involved in the various church groups, he is particularly interested in activities involving senior citizens.
