At present, a staff of three social workers offers counselling services to Halton residents. The service was initiated several years ago to serve those residents who couldn't pay for it. Since then a fee system has been introduced for those who can afford to pay some amount toward the cost.

Now the committee is considering the desirability of phasing out the regional service, in part or in whole, and buying counselling from a private agency for those

residents who can't pay. Two private agencies, Burlington Counselling and Human Relations Institute (COHR) and Oakville Family Service Bureau, are prepared to take over the region's work Burlington and Oakville


Both agencies get some of their operating monies from United Appeal. However, there is no United Appeal in the north, the agencies get no financial support from North Halton. Administrative
