

Wheelers bow to Oaks but crush Guelph 7-1

A fired up Milton Fifth Wheel major bantams dropped Guelph 7-1 to open their Tri-County season at Milton Memorial Arena Sunday.

The Wheelers started slowly, allowing the Royal City crew to jump into an early 1-0 first period lead. This lead lasted until Randy Perusello flashed the light with a low hard drive from the point from Tom Houston to tie the score at 5:29 in the opening frame.

With 1:12 remaining Doug Powers scored his first of two to put the Fifth Wheelers into the lead. Team captain Doug Riding assisted on this goal. The period ended with Milton holding a slim 2-1 edge.

In the middle frame the Fifth Wheelers pressed and did everything but put the puck in the net. Two periods of good hockey ended with the 2-1 tally.

Whatever happened in the dressing room between the second and third periods fired up the Milton crew, as they

completely dominated the Guelph squad.

The first of these goals were scored by Mark Bertoia from Powers and then Powers nailed one from Houston.

Champoux chalked up another from linemates Benton and Mauro. Mauro scored from Benton and finally Champoux notched Milton's final tally from Perusello and Benton.

On Monday the Fifth Wheelers journeyed to Oakville with little success. In their first confrontation with Oakville, the locals were edged 3-2.

Oakville jumped into a fast opening period lead by apparently catching the Fifth Wheelers napping on occasion.

Sacre Coeur and Holy Cross schools ran away with the North Halton Separate School cross country meet last Tuesday in Georgetown. There were 154 participants.

Sacre Coeur, in Georgetown, captured first place in the junior division with 33 points. St. Francis of Assisi, Georgetown, came second and St. Joseph's school, Acton, placed third. St. Peter's school in Milton came fourth while Holy Cross in Georgetown didn't qualify for placing in the junior division, consisting of boys and girls tyke and atom runners, since it didn't field complete teams.
