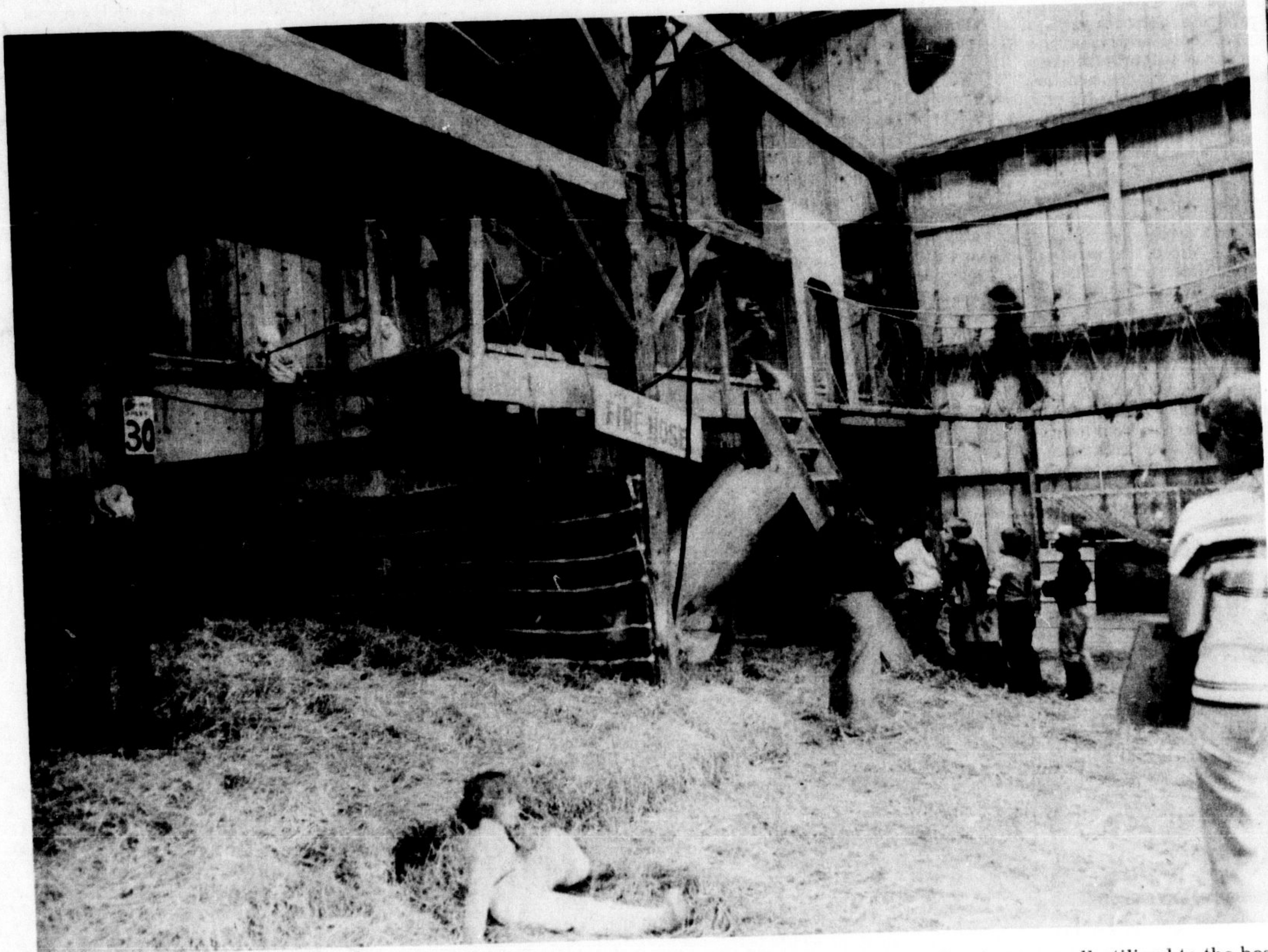


Children from J.M. Denyes visit Chudleigh's Apple Farm

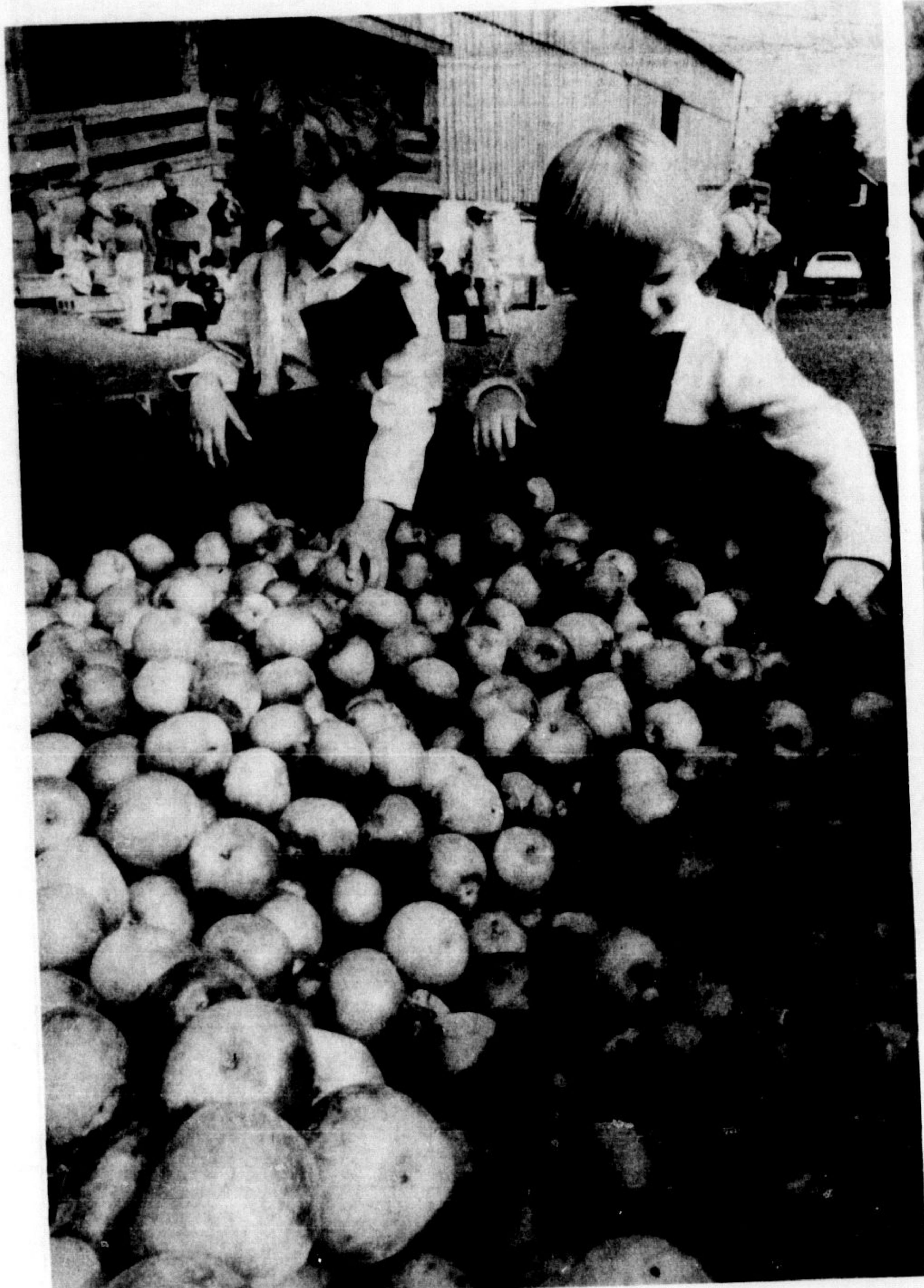

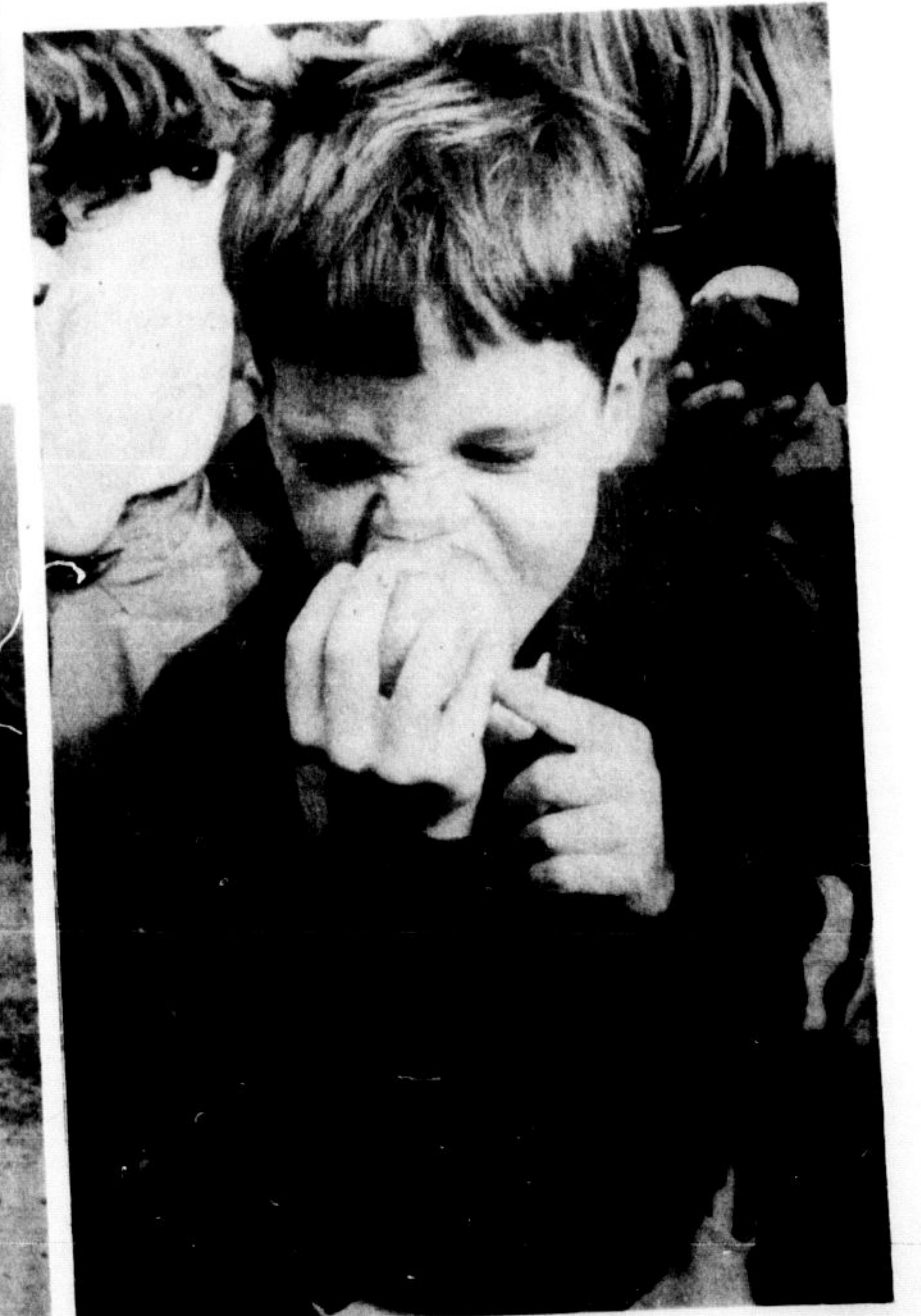


GOOD FOOD, CONVERSATION AND FRIENDS is always the perfect combination for an enjoyable time. April Bronn walks with Anita
