

vetoed the recommendation of its planning department to withhold any further studies of quarries for waste dis- on account of "high develop-

The recommendation was based on the report prepared by Engineer R.W.J. Moore.

Moore said, "It was found that all quarries on top of the escarpment were limestone quarries and as such were unsuitable for landfill purposes. It was also found that only two of the shale quarries in the region had any potential for use as landfills. These quarries are in the existing Milton Brick quarry and the Badlands area in Burling-

The Milton Brick Quarry is for. on the east side of Tremaine Rd. just north of Steeles Ave. It is known as Site H.

The Badlands area is on the north side of Highway 403 between the existing sanitary landfill site and the old Bayview landfill on King Road. (Site A) and the Natco examined for their potential Quarry, also in Burlington as waste fill sites. which is on the south side of 403 between Unsworth Ave. and Snake Rd.

Halton Council has rejected the sites.

Moore said the reasons the former two were rejected because "the owners have the Champion material extraction

which are in conflict at this time and will remain in conflict for some time."

The Natco site was rejected ment costs due mainly to difficult access."

Moore said, "We have reported in the past that both the Milton Brick (Site H) and the Burlington Badlands (Site A) have limited potential for waste disposal at the present

"Their greatest potential lies in the future after more material has been extracted, 2 qt. capacity. but too far in the future to be of any use to us now in our

present situation." He said, "We question the desirability of, or the need additional study of quarries at this time. It is our opinion that we have sufficient information on hand

At its Oct. 18 meeting, council decided otherwise and ordered the feasibility of all quarries in the region be
