Survey results show region is key issue

nuclear program and education were receive strong views from members of the Halton Liberal Association, as the result of a survey conducted this summer.

Response questionnaire formulated by Julian Reed, Halton Liberal MPP, indicated nearly 100 per cent in favor of the repeal of regional government, according to Mr. Reed.

The survey was given out to nearly 100 members of the organization, he said, and approximately 30 responses were received.

Further expansion Hydro's nuclear program was strongly rejected with a 75 per cent opposition response to the issue.

"I was interested there was that much opposition-" said Mr. Reed, adding he felt "people have certain fears and concerns" with nuclear Ontario's development. present program contributes 27 per cent of the electricity consumed in Ontario, according to Mr. Reed.

Other responses indicated with the dissatisfaction present state of education in the province, he continued. More felt the present government did not fulfill its purpose in devoting more

energy to core subjects. On the issue of resource recovery, Mr. Reed received nearly 100 per cent support for that means of waste disposal as opposed to landfill

"I felt there was a strong opinion, but I did not realize it would be that much," he said.

Mr. Reed continued that answers reinforced some of his own concerns and said he would continue to fight for resource recovery over landfill sites.

On the question of whether the Niagara Escarpment should Commission abolished or amended, the vote was split, he stated. "There is a great upset with


