Tony Agozzino of Milton Bowlway met last week with regional Big Brothers in an attempt to set up the celebrity bowl for their organization. Agozzino took over the local Main St. alley four years ago and this year opened operations in September with 12 lanes, an expansion of four. There are 600 bowlers in Milton in leagues and 225 children involved in the Youth Bowling Council movement.

The lanes are open from

noon 'til midnight seven days each week and after four years, Agozzino said he's making a living.

He started youth bowling in town, or at least got the activity moving towards what is today. When he came into the scene they had little, but today the YBC'ers have \$1,000 in their bank account, have a year-end banquet and have things they never really had before.
