Student reading time misused: trustee

The glowing picture painted of the success of the Halton Board of Education's remedial reading program by board staff received an unflattering review from Oakville Trustee Elsie Hilson during last Thursday's meeting at Burlington.

The program has great benefit to the student body, superintendent of special services R. G. Chapman told board members.

Not so, according to Mrs. Hilson who claimed she has heard of children being used, during the time set aside for reading, to move chairs for teachers. She indicated the children are sometimes left on their own, too. She wanted the board to undertake an inspection to ensure the time is used properly.

Chapman said he would follow up on the tip. Director of Education Em Lavender also requested details of Mrs. Hilson's information. The meeting was working through the report of a document titled Achievement Statement on Board Objectives 1976-78.

Solar hospital heat

Solar energy will be used in a hospital for the first time in Ontario to preheat hot water at the 365-bed Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital in Oakville.

The Ontario Ministries of Energy and Health will jointly finance the project following a study prepared for the ministries earlier this year. Tenders are being called.

The \$150,000 hospital system will make use of the sun's energy whenever it is available to preheat approximately 7.5 million gallons of hot water used annually. No storage tank or bin is needed because the preheated water will be used soon after it passes through the solar collectors.

Police say seat belt could have saved man

Wearing a seatbelt could have saved the life of a Burlington man, Milton OPP said.

Police spokesmen said Robert Cant, 42, of 684 Arvea Cres. was thrown out of his car after it had gone over an embankment and rolled over on Highway 5 near the 16 Mile Creek bridge Sunday.

Coroner Dr. Graham Owen at Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital pronounced Cant dead on arrival, police said. The accident occurred around 9 a.m.

Police said the vehicle went off the road, broke through a fence and plunged down the embankment and rolled over near the creek.

The American-made car was extensively damaged. The victim was taken to hospital by Halton Ambulance Service. Investigating the accident is Const. J. A. Levesque.

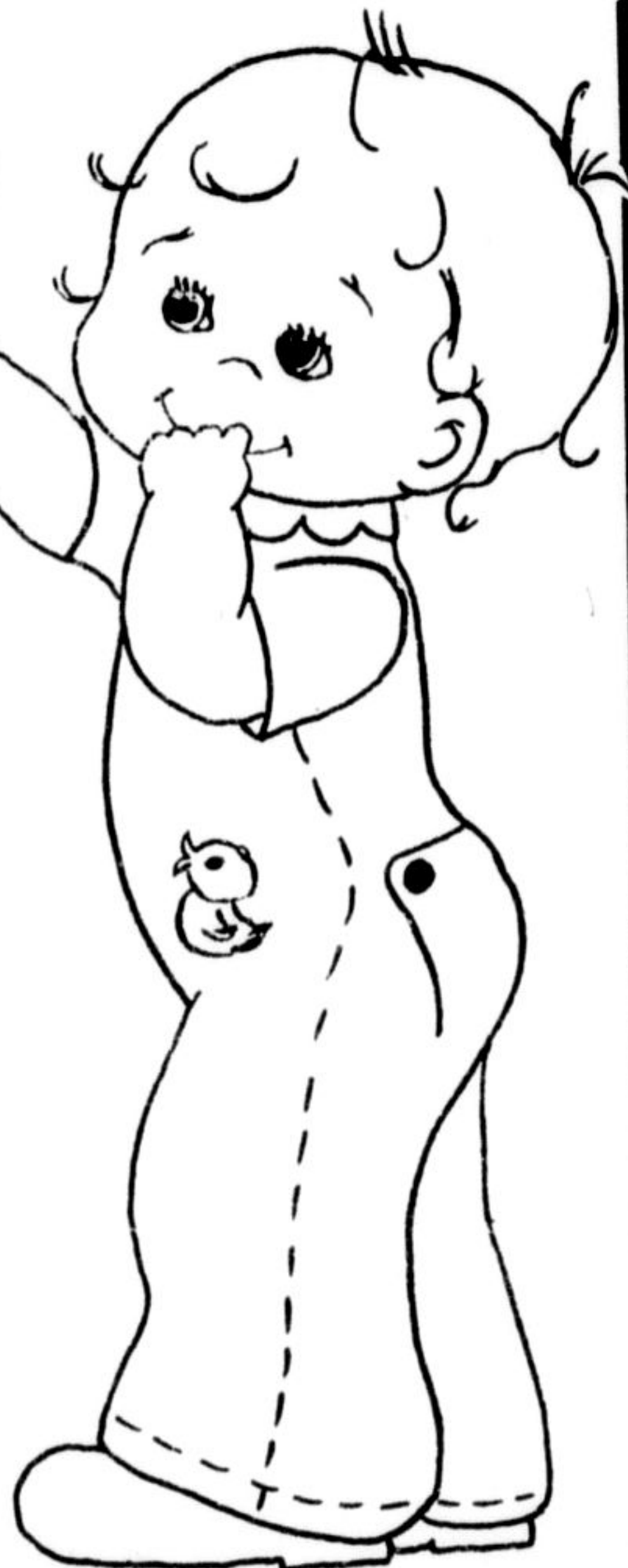

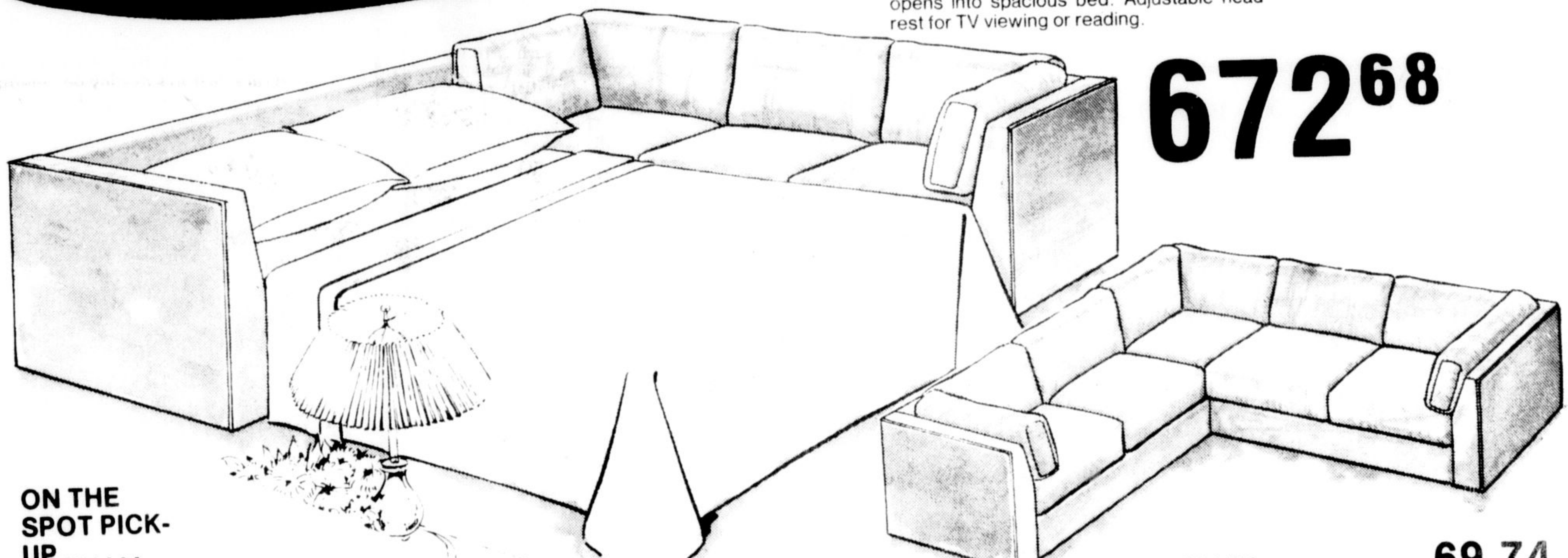

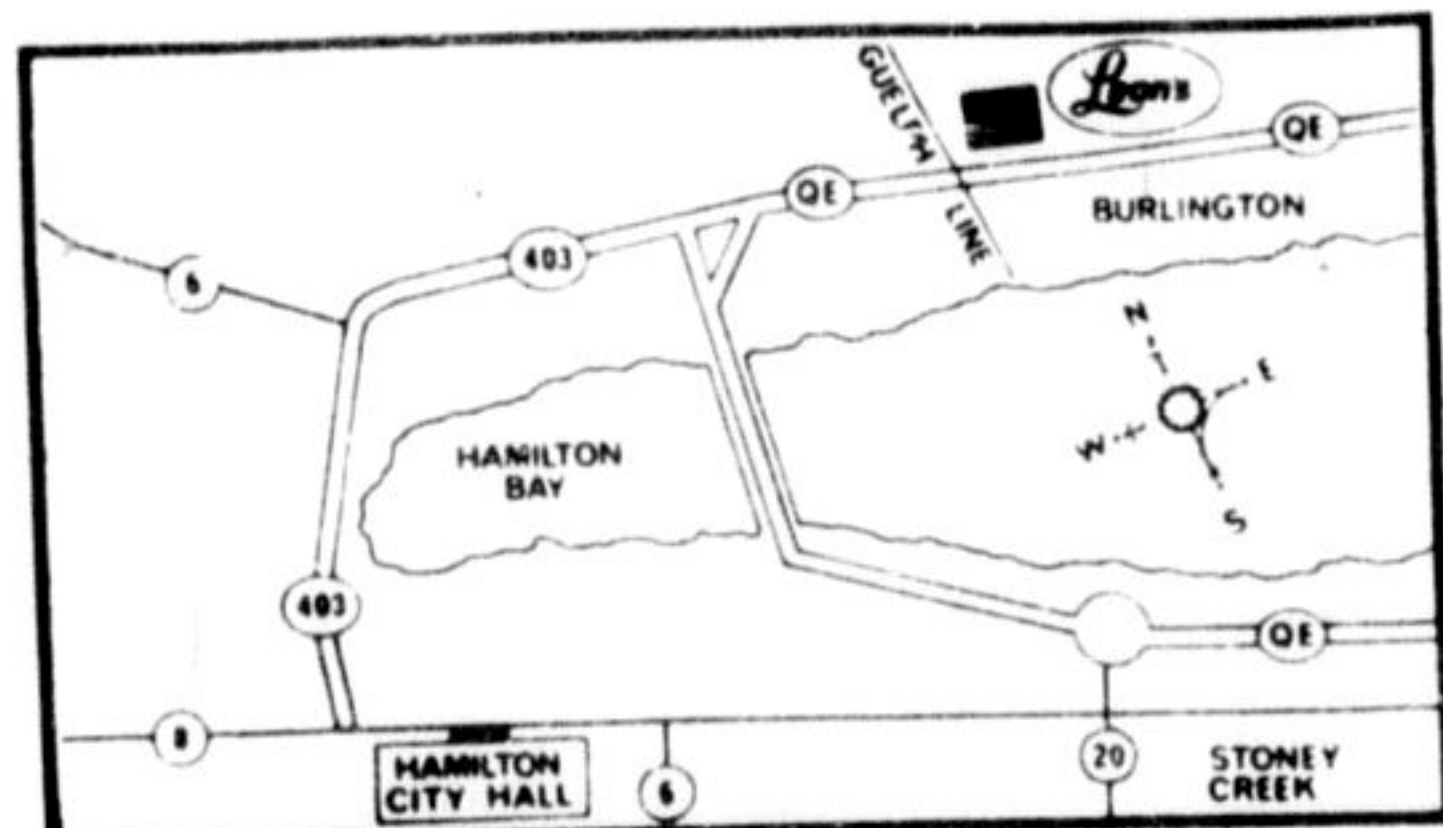
