Constitution is accepted at soccer annual meeting

John Morgan was voted in as president of the Milton Youth Soccer Club following the annual general meeting Monday evening at the Milton fire hall on Main St.

Morgan, registrar this past year, replaces Fritz Schicht who will sit on the executive as immediate past president.

Trevor Preddy replaced Reg Griffin as the club vice-president and Dennis Quinton was elected the registrar for the coming year.

Griffin said nobody listened to him last year and when he attempted to organize the program, all he got was a lot of flack.

Griffin said he thought the MYSC could have done more last year to make progress and he said the executive this year will do a better job.

"I'm disappointed," Griffin said and explained that the MYSC had the money to do much more last year than it did. Team photographs was one idea not accepted by the rest of the executive.

He said he may continue to work behind the scenes if he finds the time. He will be working with organizing the Red Cross in Milton, he told The Champion.

The by-laws were amended and voted into acceptance with four minor changes and elimination of items two and three in rule 20 which deals with draws at the conclusion of regulation time in playoff of cup games.

The rule simply reads, "Two 10 minute overtime periods, alternating end of field, if still tied at the end of overtime the game will be replayed."

Game points will be forfeited next year if a team fails to appear for a game or if a team delays the start of a game by 15 minutes or more.

In the event that neither team fields a minimum of seven players no points shall be awarded and the game shall be replayed. It should be noted that if one team has a full complement of players that team will play the match using their full complement.

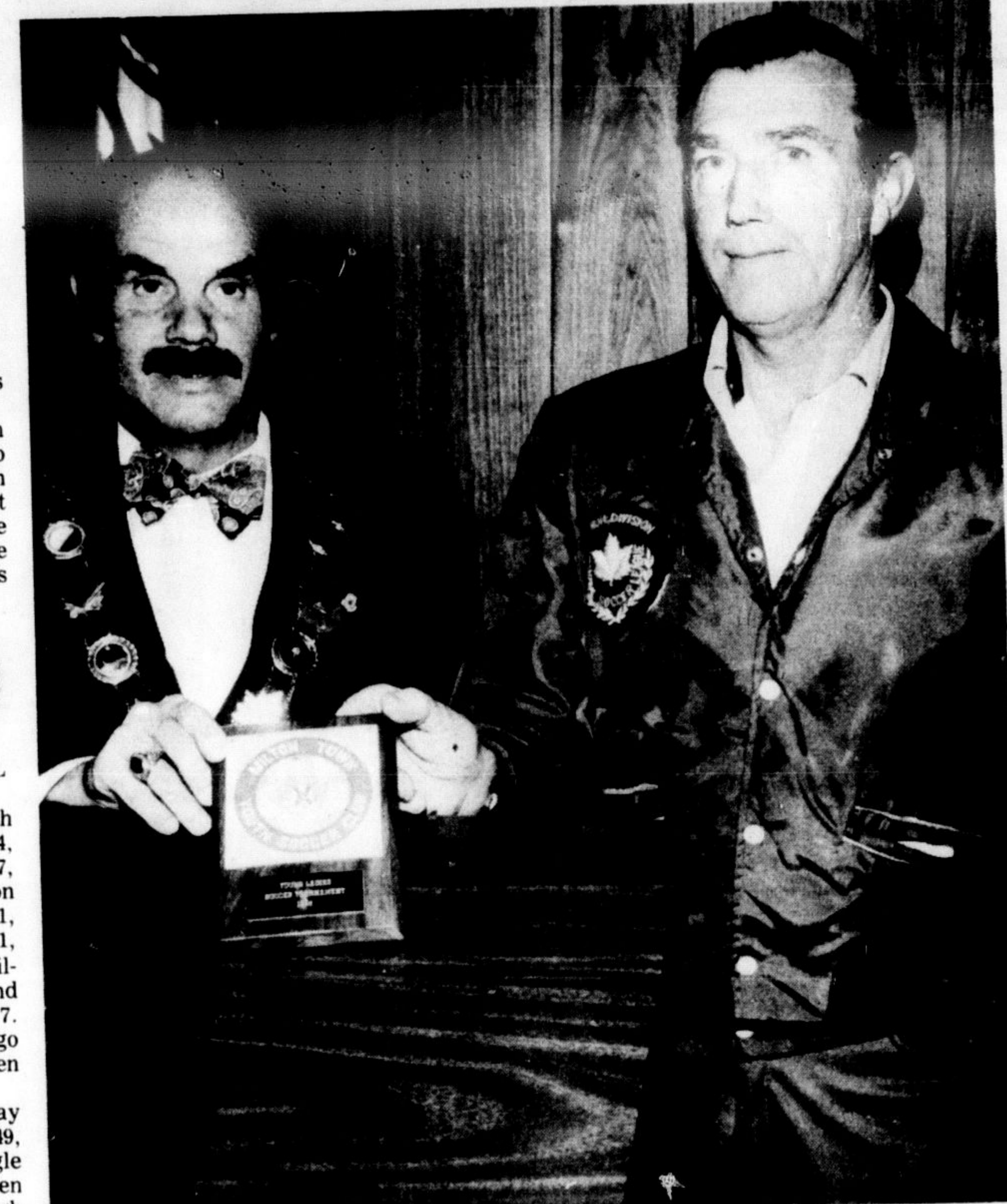

Argos win Grey Cup with Milton players
