**Top posters earn trophies**

Milton Fire Department this week announced the winners of the department's 1978 fire prevention poster contest. Each year the firefighters run a poster contest on the theme "Fire Prevention in the Home" and all children in the grade five level are eligible to enter. Again this year the firefighters were deluged with entries and the judges had a difficult time choosing the winners.

Coulson toured the town, making presentations to the winners. Top boy and girl each received a trophy. Winning the girls' division was Gloria Marchesich, 10, of 108 Court St. N. She is a student at Holy Rosary School. Runner-up was 10-year-old Kelly Penman, of 853 Fraser Ct., a St. Peter's School student.

Top boy was Torben Jensen, 9, of 379 Ontario St. N. who attends Robert Baldwin School. The runner-up boy was Richard Morris, 10, of 877 Willow Ave., a St. Peter's student.

Gloria's poster dwelt on four fire hazards — smoking in bed, children playing with matches, spray cans near heat, and overloaded circuits. Torben's winner depicted fireplace safety. Both runners-up were about overloaded outlets.

Fire Chief Coulson said the four winners will go into the Halton Region fire prevention poster contest, winners of which will be announced later this month. Winners from the Halton competition (top boy and girl only) will go to the all-Ontario contest.

Victoria Wood, developer of the Timberlea subdivision has been given an ultimatum by the town: Clean up your act, or else.
