Pupils soon realized that their arms do not stretch down to the floor, she said, adding that pupils quickly became aware of eyebrows, eyelashes and other features. When parents arrived in the classroom for the interview with the teacher later that evening, mums and dads were asked to identify their child's desk and books with the aid of the paper models.

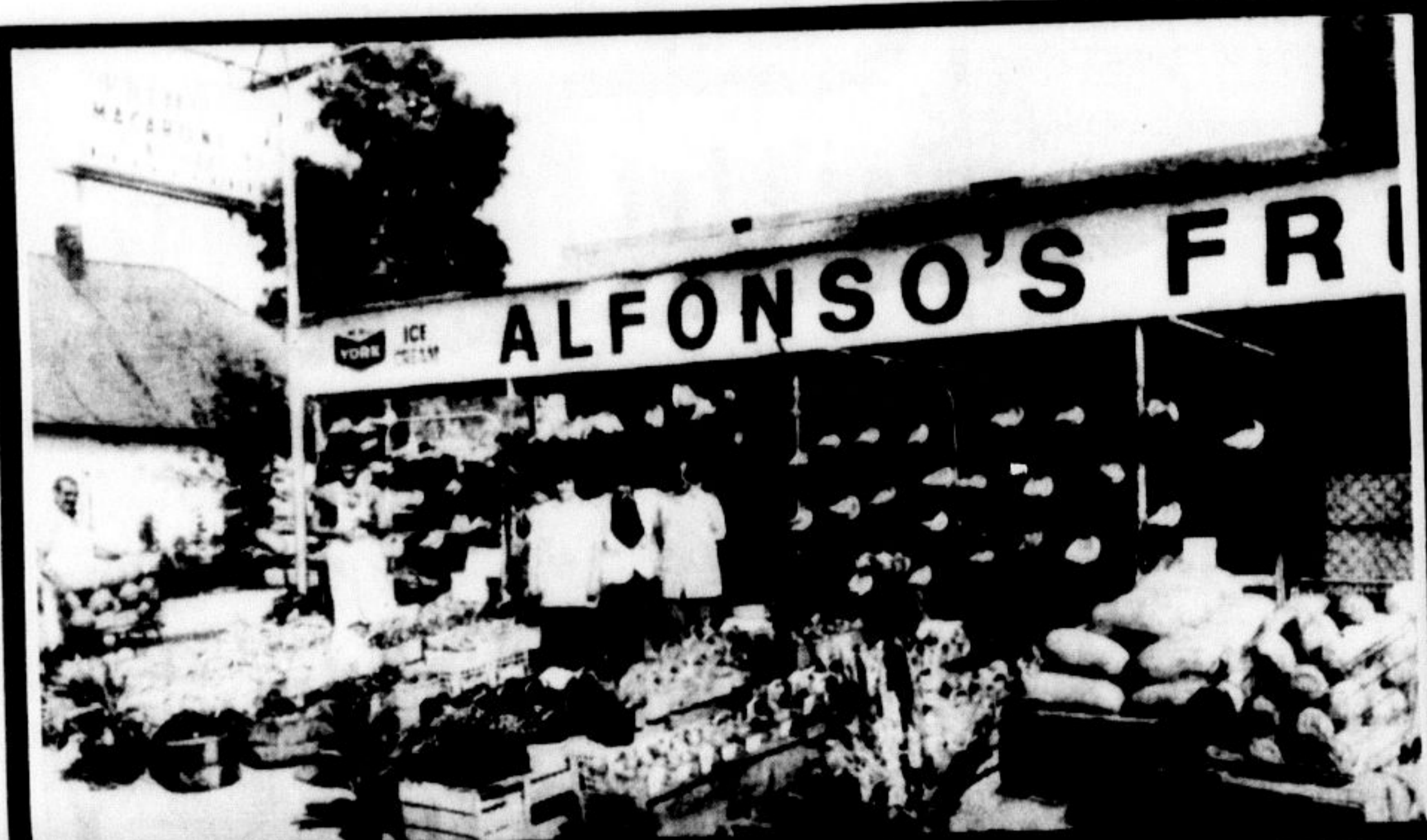
