

'Ounce of prevention' can mean safe holiday

Avoid fire hazards around the home at Christmas, advise the home economists, Home Economics Branch, Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

The natural Christmas tree can become a fire hazard if not selected and set up with care. Select a tree that is moist and flexible not dry and brittle. Store it outdoors until you are ready to bring it inside.

Christmas trees have long embodied different kinds of tradi-Many families mark the year of their lives by adding new ornaments to their holiday decorations each year.

Churches also decorate Christmas trees, and many churches have adopted ornaments that tell a story, such as the "Chrismon" tree. The word Chrismon is a combination of "Christ" and "monogram," meaning "monogram of Christ." Colors of the ornaments are restricted to white and gold,

The decorations, which include traditional Nativity scenes, animals and Biblical items like chariots and crosses, are also symbolic - like the white rose which symbolizes the infant.

Once the tree is set up, the cut end should be immersed in water at all times. Be sure that the tree is not blocking access to doors or windows in case of fire. Keep it away from drapes and heat sources such as fireplaces, television sets and radiators.

If you like to decorate with candles, place them where they cannot be knocked down or blown over, never on the tree. Instead, use Canadian Standards Association (CSA) certified light sets whose cords and connections are in good condition.

Other tree decorations should be nonflammable and, if possible, unbreakable. breakable and pets.

Cotton batting or discarded connections is a fire hazard, as are trical tape. electrical toys which give off sparks.

answer? Not necessarily. Some plastic trees are flamthose of aluminum, are fire-tinguisher on hand. proof. Metallic trees are conductors of electricity so must your Christmas preparations be illuminated with spotlights, not strings of lights. and merry Christmas.

Many beautiful effects can be achieved with lighting outside the home. For outdoor safety, use only weatherproofed equipment labelled for outdoors. Sockets must be



hung with the bulb pointing downward. Wherever possible, run cords above the ground. Strings can be held in place with insulated staples treasures near the top of the (not nails, tacks or brads) or tree out of reach of children run through hooks obtainable from hardware stores.
