A further 600 detached semi-detached houses are expected to be completed within the next 12 months, as Timberlea moves into the second phase of construction, he

At this time nearly 300 houses in the complex bounded by Derry Rd., Thompson Rd., and Ontario St. S. are finished.

The total Timberlea village will accommodate 1,400 homes.

"Completion of the Alliance and Timberlea projects will complete all the residential development that can go in the town," said Mr. Weido.

Building statistics show 1978 to be a slow construction year, he said, despite brisk housing construction starts.


