(Continued from Page 1) the region . . . to seek approval of the OMB for acquisition of these lands."

Mr. Estrin, who has twice defeated the region on Site F matters before the Ontario Supreme Court, said if the region decided to act on Mr. Perlin's recommendations, "The region would be acting illegally and its actions would be subject to judicial review or to a quashing application."

Mr. D. Estrin Jan. 16, 1979, the appropriate application to the Town of Milton for approval to acquire lands shall not be made until after Milton's official plan has been amended to permit the establishment of a landfill site at Site F."

The controversy over Miss Smith's property resulted in an amendment dealing specifically with her: "That further this council wishes to indicate it has no intention of displacing Miss Bessie Smith or her brother from their lands unless they so wish."

This amendment was approved along with the others.

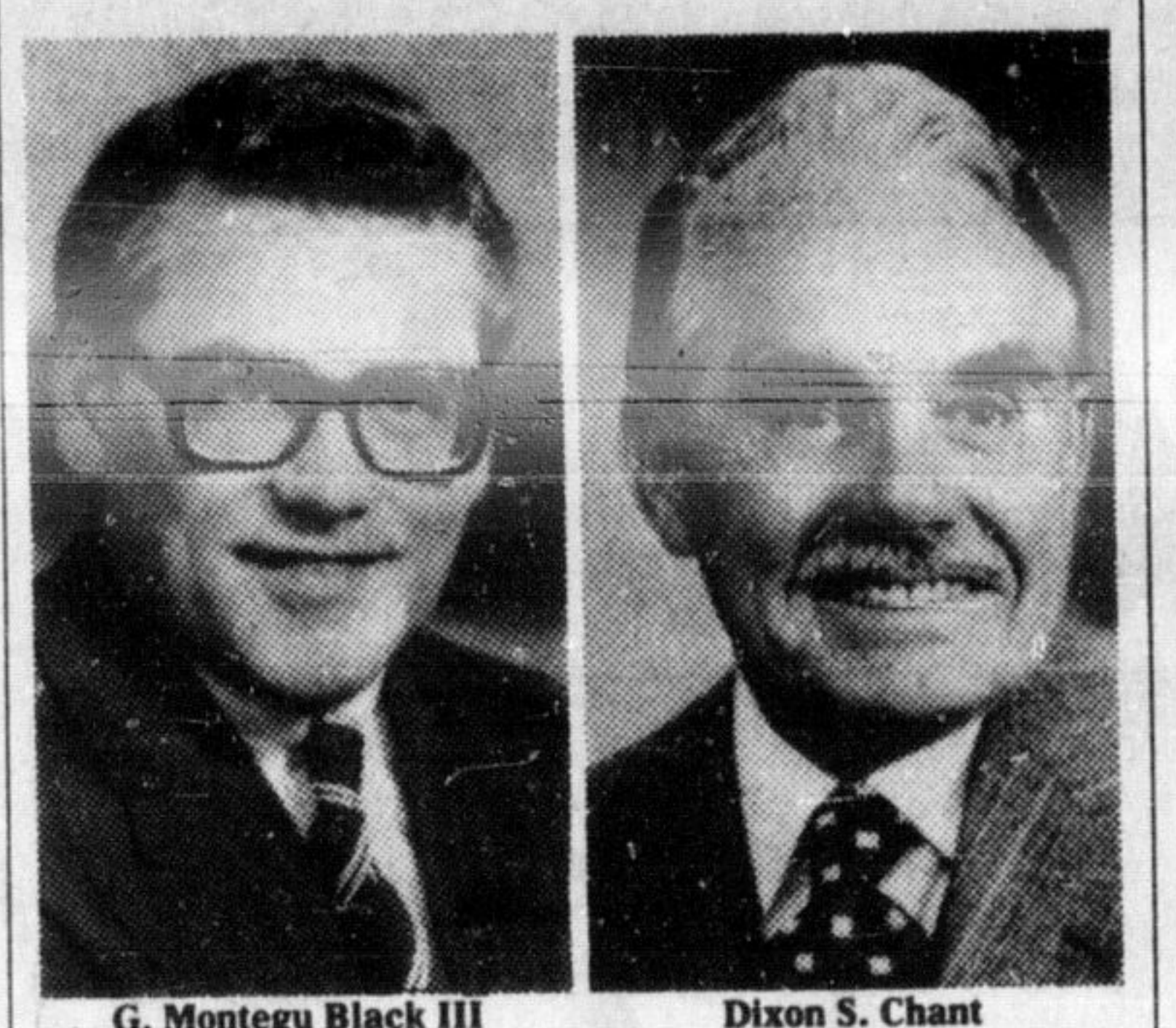
