Acton handled easily in spirited performance

It was an exciting spectacle of desire and talent Friday evening at Milton Memorial Arena when the Milton Jr. "B" Flyers defeated the Acton Sabres 7-3.

Penalty-killing played a major role in the win as defenceman Brett Patterson was outstanding blocking numerous shots with his body. Todd Sheppard and Rod Gooding were also standouts in the penalty killing department.

Sheppard was sidelined after being speared and missed the second half of the game, but he'll be back in the lineup for Friday's action with

Georgetown Gemini. Coach Doug Vaughan was confident going into the match and remains so as the Flyers continue to hustle and go "all out" in search of more points and the elusive shutout game. The team went 48 minutes without allowing a goal Friday.

The tough contest for Milton this weekend will be in the Dixie arena Sunday.

Flyers started strong as Jim Court and Rod Gooding set up Paul McCann's first goal at 10:30 of the first period while Sabre Kelly McArthur was in the sin bin.

E.J. Millett, who also had an aggressive performance, combined with McCann to set up Mike Kalapaca's goal with 28 seconds remaining in the frame.

The second period spelled the victory for Milton and the second loss for Sabres in the Milton Arena this season with Flyers being four goals.

The first came at 14:30 when McCann took his third point of the night and with Mike Murray at the point, fed Gooding for the count.

Marty Venner notched his first of a pair with Patterson and Ben Allen assisting at 9:02 and Allen fired his goal at 3:17 from Venner.

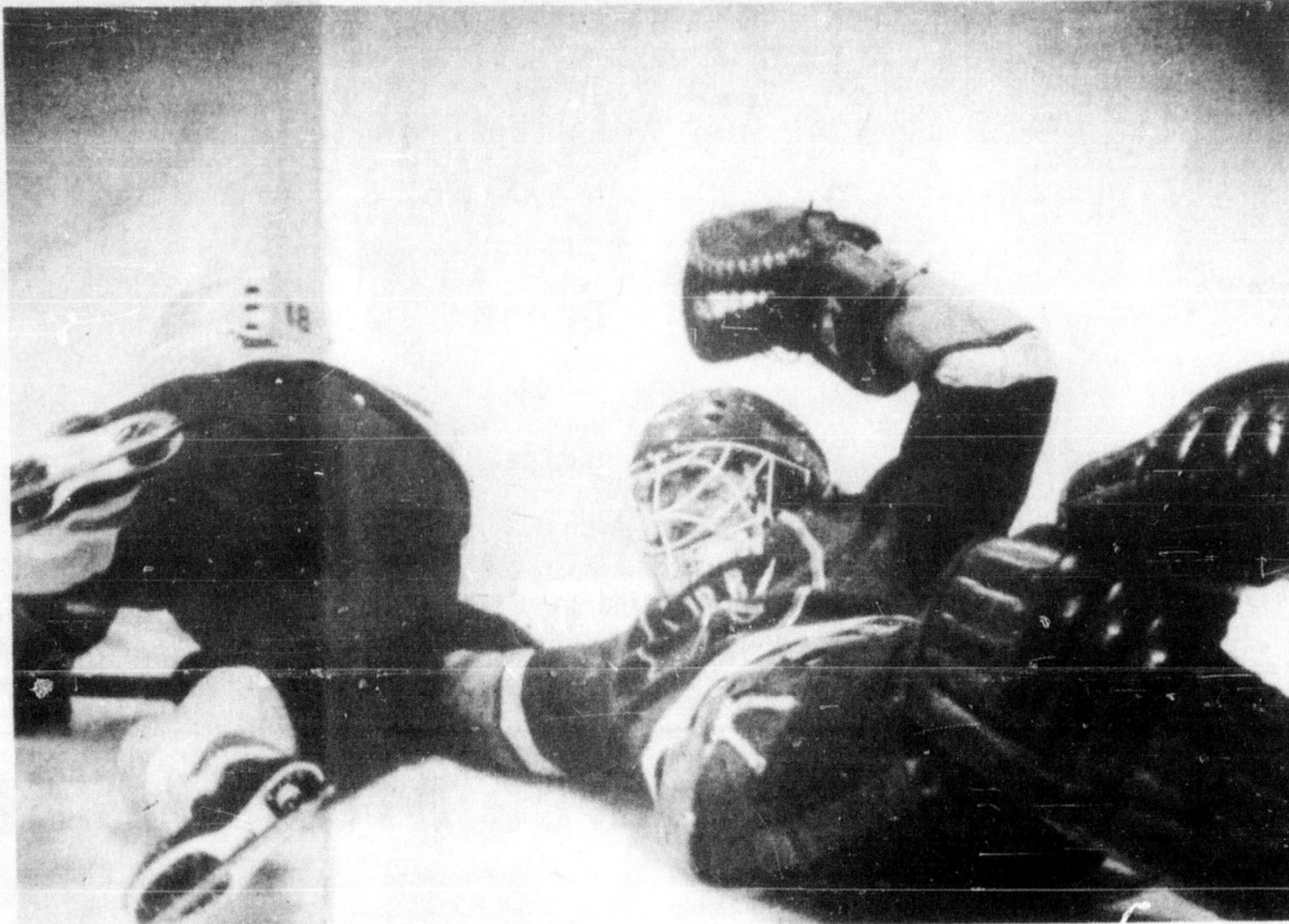
Captain Dave Turner was aided by reliable linemate Gooding.
