Can-Am group seeks your hockey talent

For the past three years the CAN/Am Hockey Group of Guelph has been involved in placing Canadian hockey players with European professional teams.

Each Spring Can/Am holds European tryout camps at Guelph for Canadian and American players wanting to play hockey in Europe. Also in attendance are the coaches and managers from various European teams, who are looking for players, especially those from Germany, Holland and Switzerland.

"These camps have proved successful for both players and coaches," according to

Can/Am co-ordinator Terry Miller. "This past fall, Can/Am visited Europe to explore the demand for North American players. We found that North American players who can obtain non-import status with a given country were in high demand," Miller said.

For a Canadian player to receive non-import status he must have been born when his father held citizenship or dual citizenship or have been born in the country in question, but need no longer be a citizen.

Canadians playing in Europe have done exceptionally well. Time

and time again they have been tops in scoring and leading point getters. Hockey fans throughout Europe exhibit appreciation for the Canadian players and the talents they bring with them.

Can/Am's major request for players comes from Germany, Holland and Switzerland. Presently there are many openings in these countries for non-import players. This could provide an opportunity for an athlete to play professional hockey and further an individual's playing career.

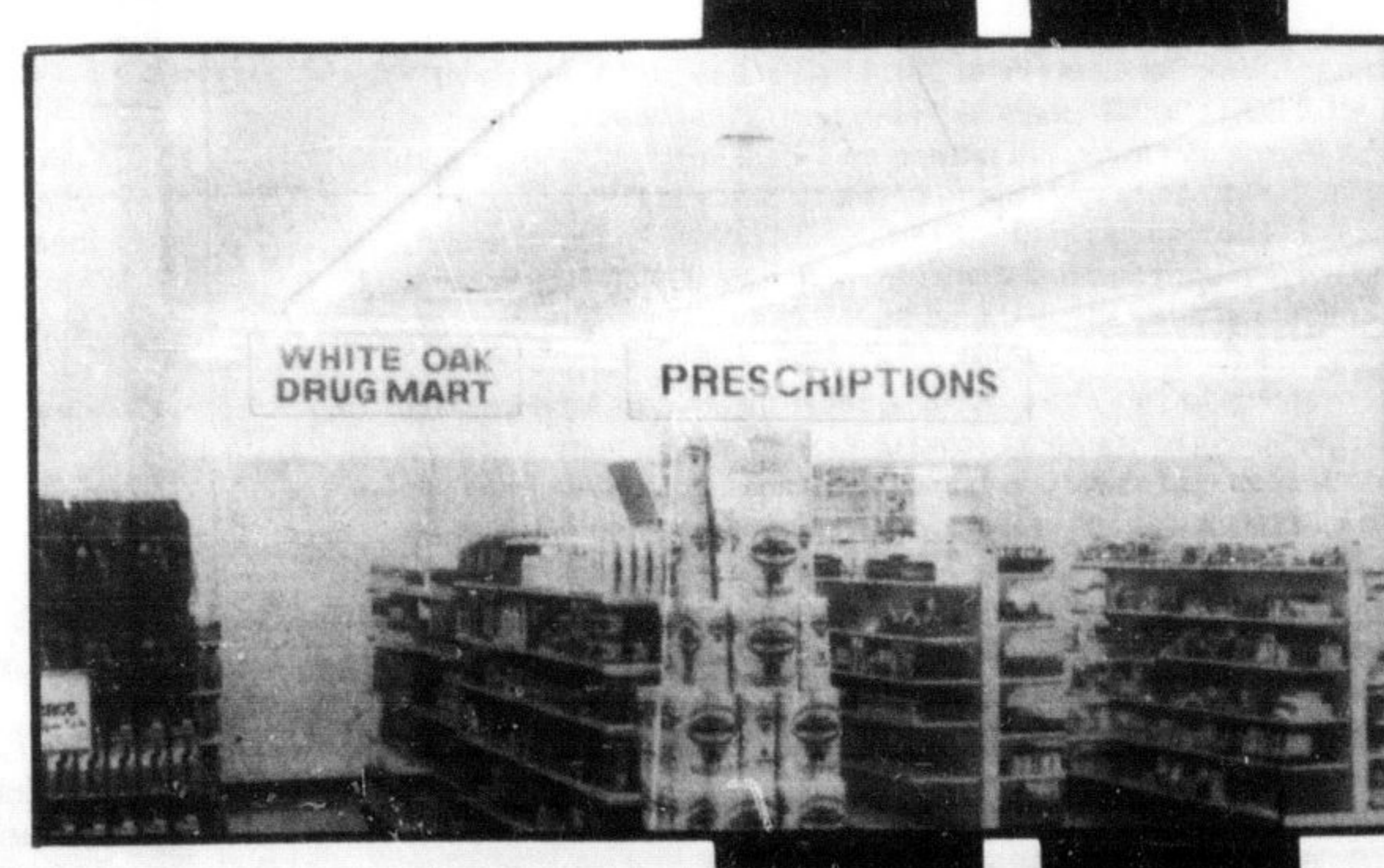
