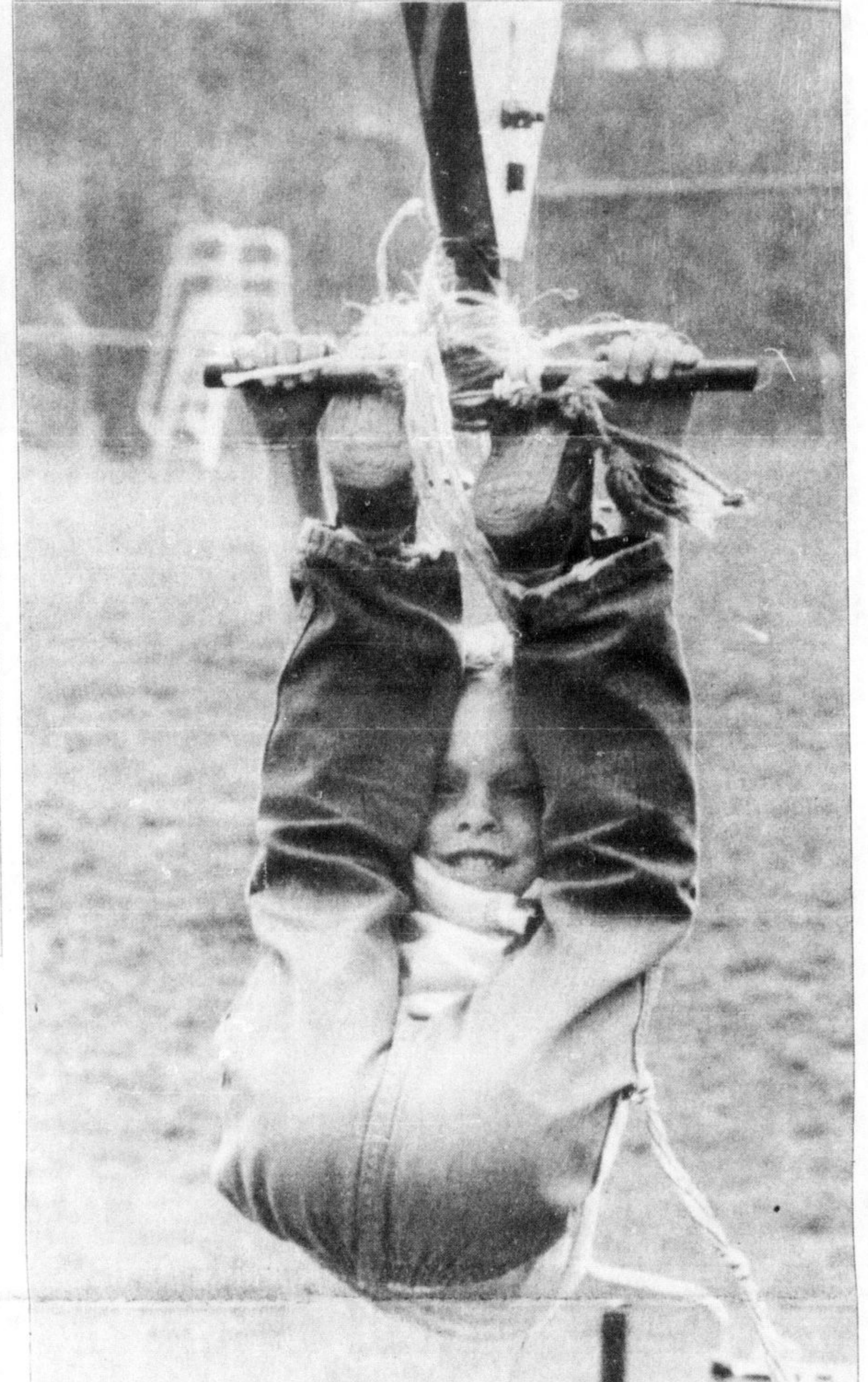

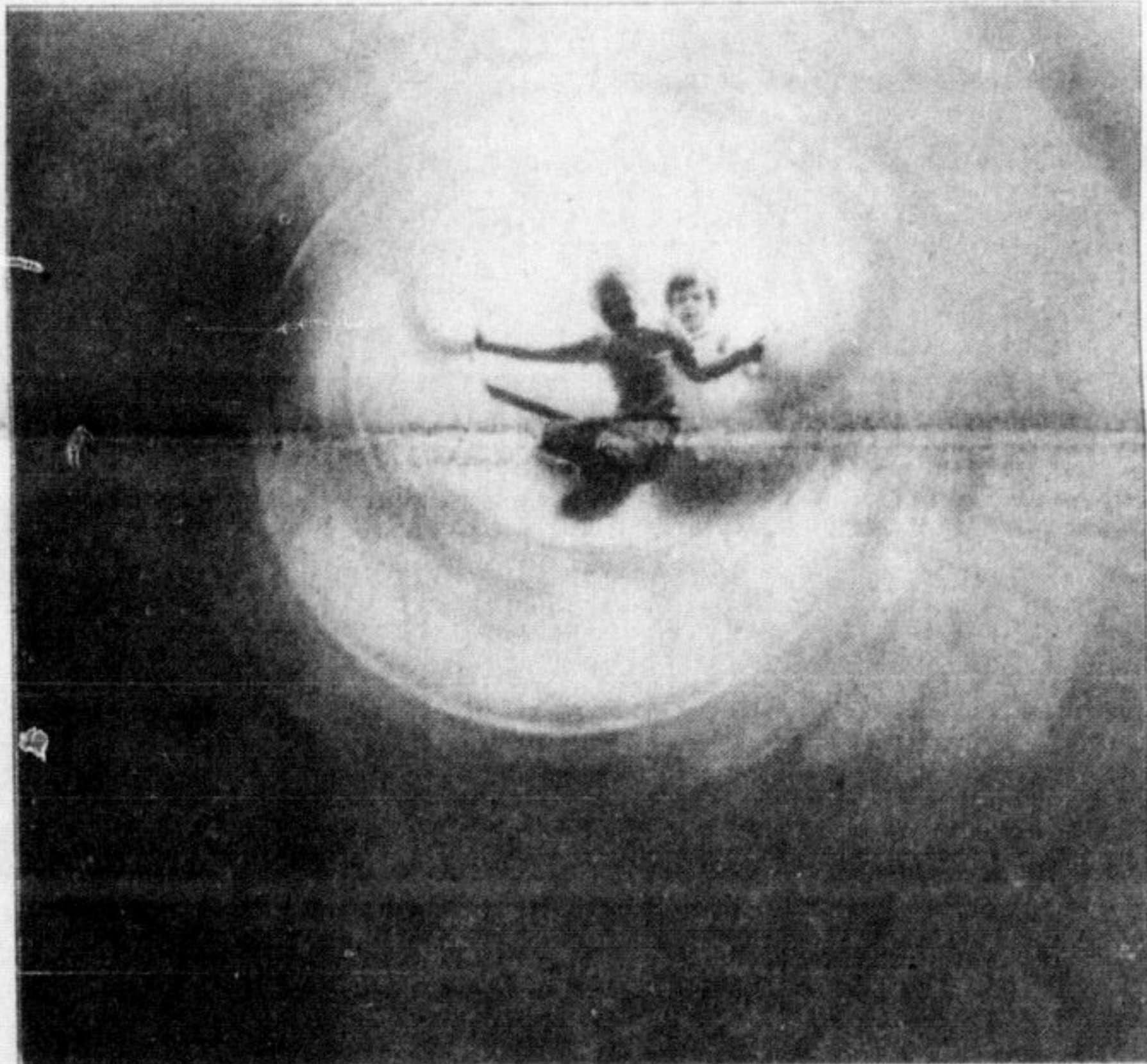
Marcellus Ave. and Jane Baetz of Woodward Ave. were kept busy pushing youngsters.

JUST HANGING AROUND, Luke Doering of 561 Childs Dr. has an unusual way to ride the guide wire at Rotary Park.



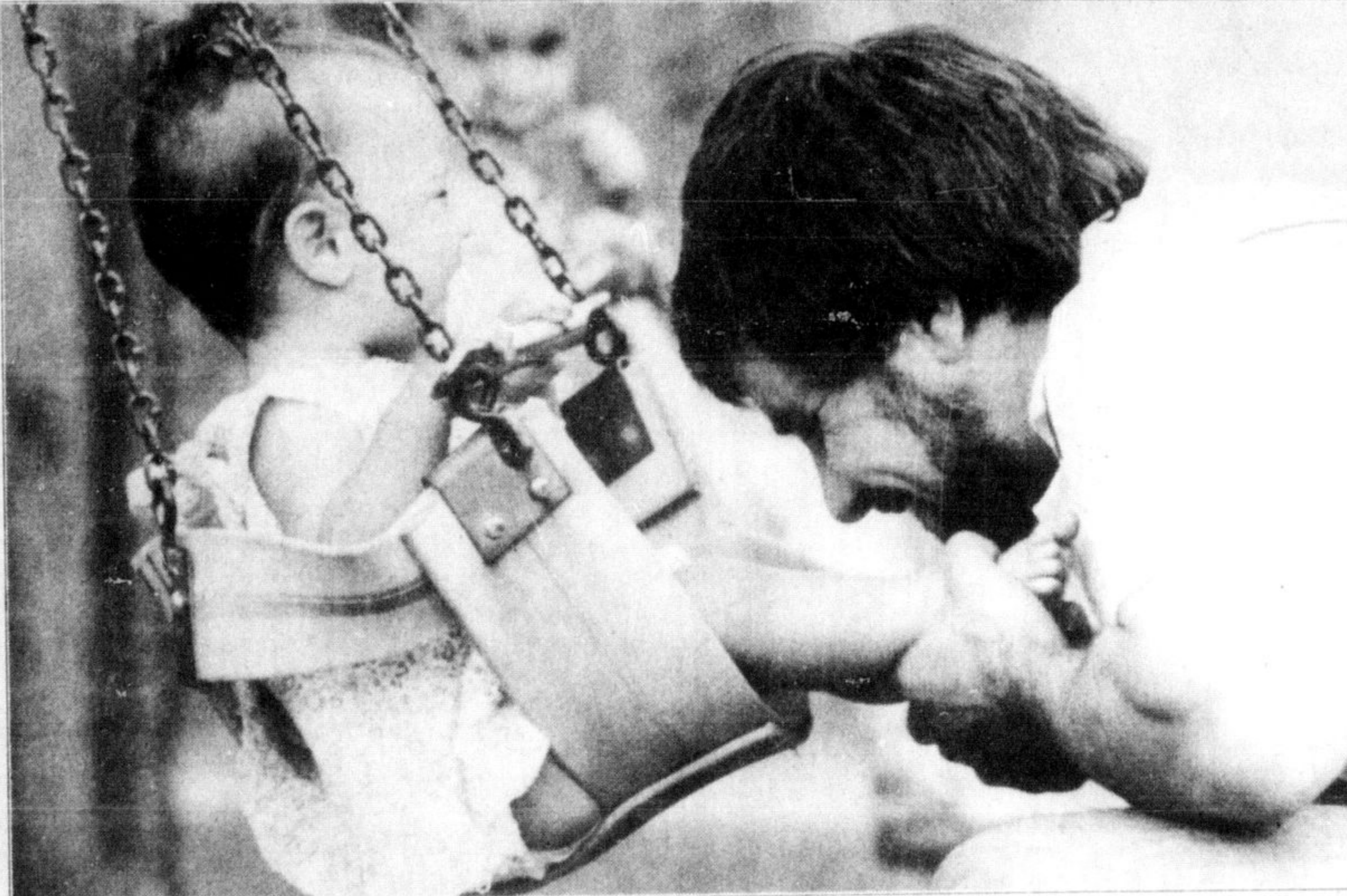
IT'S NO TUNNEL VISION if you're not into swinging, but fun can still be had at the playground equipment in Rotary Park furnished by the Town.



SOME BOYS remember when swings were made from used tires, ropes and suspended from a tree. Such a swing used to be located in Centennial Park by the Mill Pond.



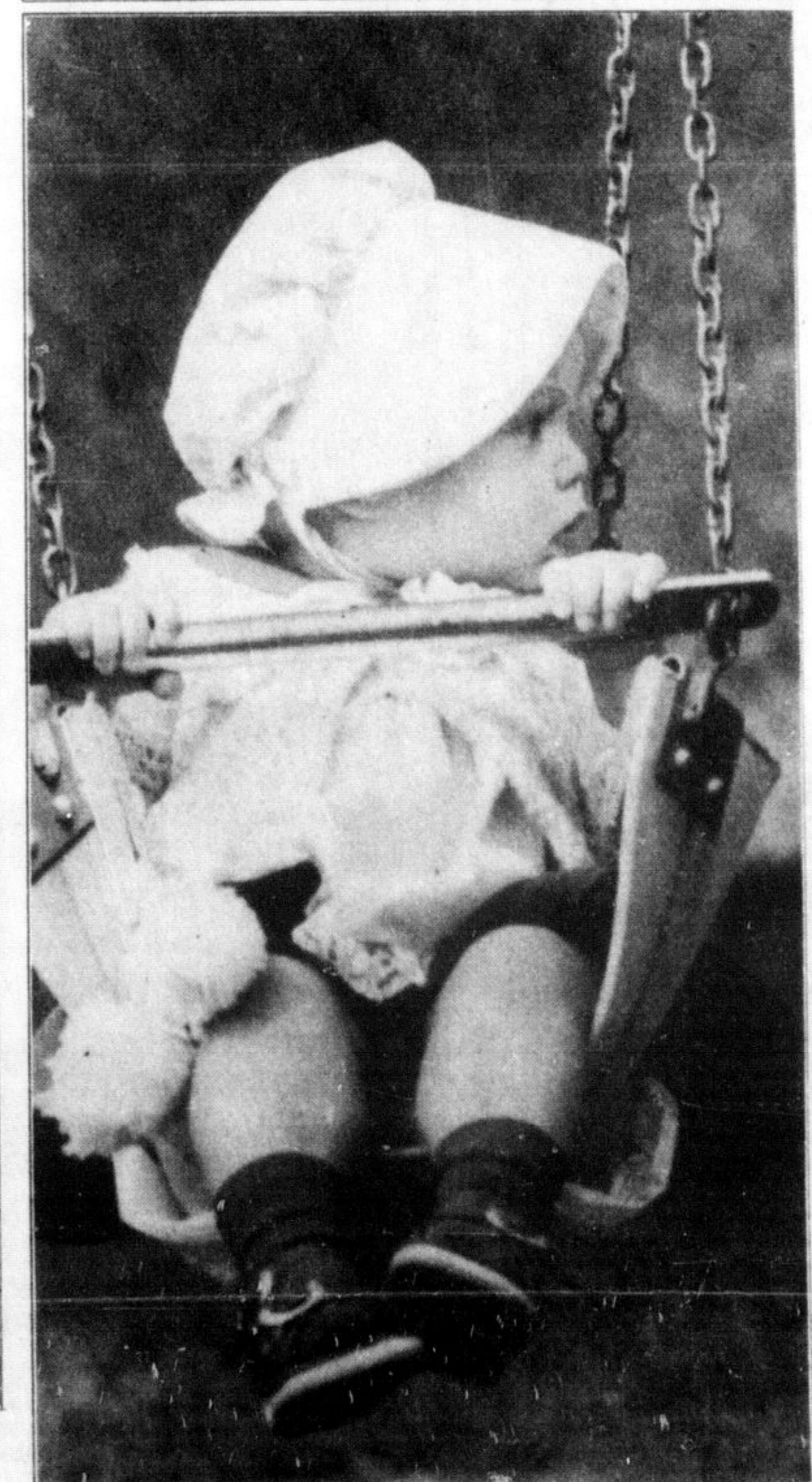
FRIENDS OF DONNA McLauchlin, 11, of Bronte St. visited Rotary Park with her. They are John and Gary Moffat of Bramalea.
