President for this year's reunion was Chuck Hamilton of Oakville, with Mr. and Mrs. Ian Break of Hornby as host and hostess.

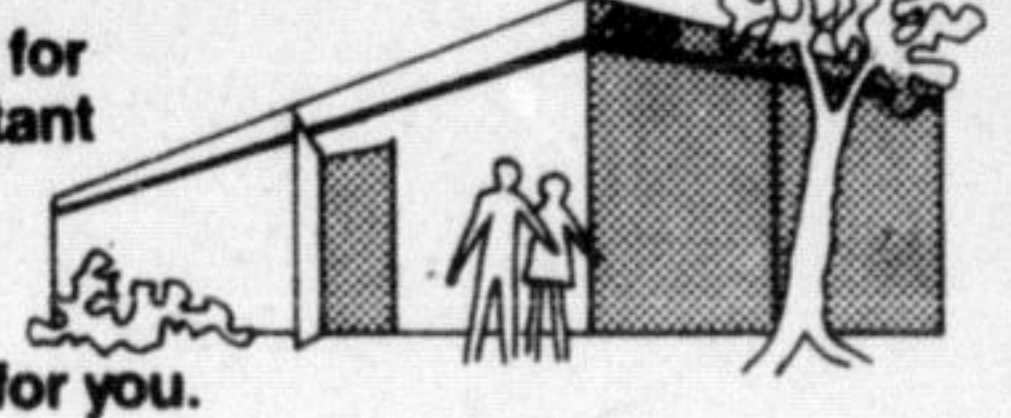
Favoured by a hot, sunny day, the gathering took pleasure testing their skills in a number of contests, games and races, organized by Mrs. Break.
