



TRAFFIC WAS DISRUPTED in Milton all last week as work crews from Canadian Pacific Railway ripped up level crossings at Martin St. Wednesday and Ontario St. Friday. Traffic detours were set up around the crossings. A mobile crane was used to lift

## Busing requested to Sacre-Coeur

Haltos separate school education committee will be recommending at the June 26 meeting of the Board that transportation from Milton be provided for French-speaking students who wish to attend Sacre-Coeur school, Georgetown.

Cliff Byrnes, director of education, read to the committee at last Tuesday's meeting a letter sent to him by J. L. Thibault, the secretary from the Association des Parents et Instituteurs.

In the letter Mr. Thibault referred to the growing number of French families in the Milton area and their desire to have their children educated in French. One parent is already driving her child to Georgetown daily since there is no provided bus transportation.

Mr. Thibault attached to the letter the names of 12 children who will require transportation in the fall to Sacre-Coeur. He feels this number will increase before September.

Mr. Byrnes told the committee that the planned reorganization of the bus routes could solve this problem for the

French families and at no additional cost to the Board.

The committee will recommend to the board that transportation be provided from Milton to Sacre-Coeur and return daily for French-speaking students registered at Sacre-Coeur in grade one through eight.

It has been recommended that alternate day transportation be provided for French-speaking pupils registered in the Kindergarten program at Sacre-Coeur. According to Mr. Byrnes, Madame Norman, principal at Sacre-Coeur, the kindergarten class for all children will

be re-organized on a full day, alternate day basis. Finance chairman Michael Strelbisky noted that the pick-up from Milton would boost the scarce enrolment in some classes at Sacre-Coeur. Members will present the item to the Board at the regular meeting.
