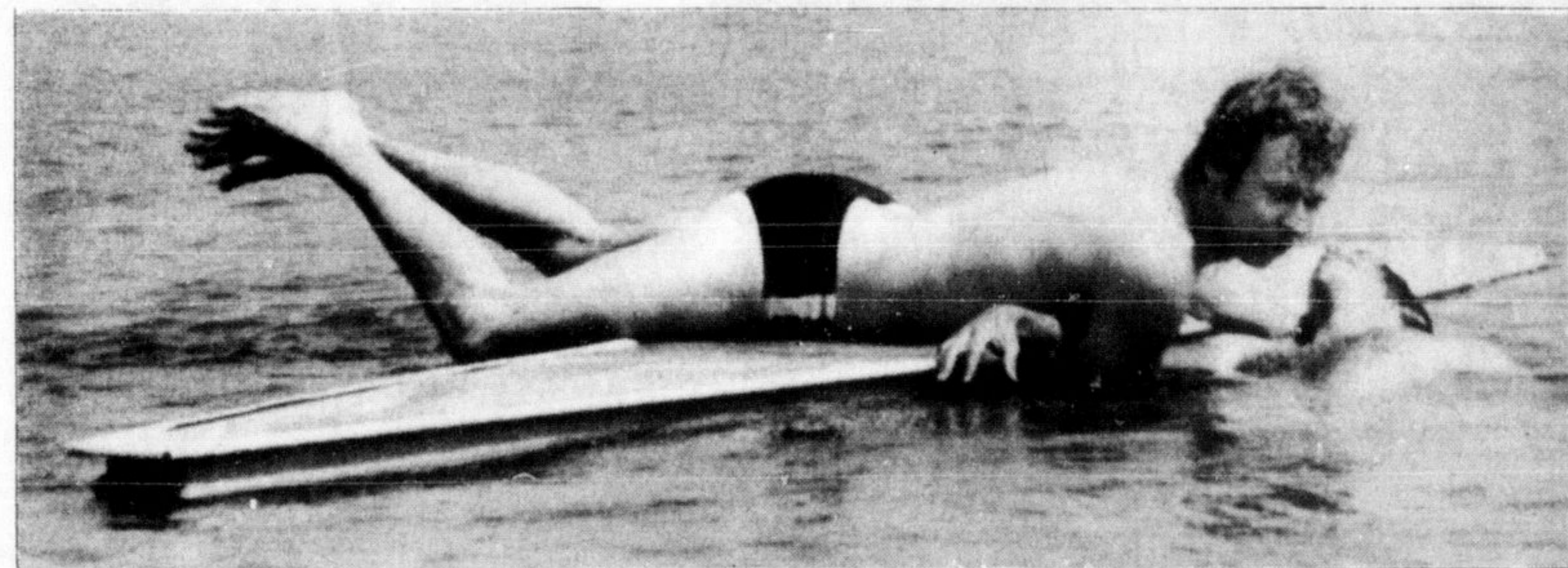

## Board eases transfer rules gives 70 students choice

About 70 high school students, shuffled in the Halton system since childhood, get a privileged voice under more lenient board rules. Halton Board of Education trustees made changes to school borders in north Halton while demonstrating new responses to parents' demands for an easing of the rules regarding student transfers from school to school, during Thursday's board meeting at Burlington.

The alterations to school boundaries and new rules came in a staff prepared package. However, it was Oakville trustee Jackie Cutmore's persistence that drew attention to some students who started their education in the former Snider's School

When that Kindergarten to grade five school closed, youngsters took lessons at Palermo until doors there were shut. Then Percy Merry kindergarten to grade six school took them in. Today about half attend Montclair senior public school and the balance are just finishing their first year at White Oaks in Oakville.

"We've a duty to give them an education and that doesn't include moving them around," said Cutmore. The Oakville trustee succeeded in persuading enough trustees to agree to drop the staff recommendation that would see the students who started at Snider's School transferring to Milton High School in September, 1980.

While permitting the 70 students to remain at White Oaks rather than having them attend at Milton, trustees passed in the same package recommendations sending some grade nine and ten students from Burlington's Lester B. Pearson school to Milton High School and others from the Milton High School to the new Drury High School, also at Milton.

"My concern was why should we give one area of the region the option and not the rest," Superintendent Lindley said Friday. Both White Oaks and Pearson are over capacity today and they will remain at capacity even with the transfers to Milton because people will be going to those schools from neighborhoods, he said.

Construction of the new Drury school will cut travel time for some of the 350 children from Georgetown, Acton and Esquesing who bus to the General Wolfe and General Brock vocational schools.
