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School histories to be recorded

The history of Holy Rosary school, Milton, given by Father Lardie at the 25th anniversary of the school and convent, has generated interest in a written history.

At the regular meeting of Halton Separate School Board, Tuesday June 26, it was suggested by Mike Strelisky that the history be related by Father Lardie and written for both the school and board resource centre. Mr. Strelisky said that he found the story of the school's beginning fascinating.

"The history behind the development of the school system was under very trying circum-

stances and involved a great commitment by those who were first involved. It is a fascinating story and well worth keeping for future reference," he said.

John Visser, Burlington Ward 7 trustee, said if a history were to be written on Milton, then why not include one on Burlington, Oakville and Georgetown. He suggested that although the separate school in Acton is just starting perhaps it should be recorded as well. Mr. Visser also suggested making it a project for the children at the schools. "Perhaps it would make the children aware that starting a school is no easy task," he said.

The board asked the director to arrange for histories to be written.

A letter will be sent to Father Lardie regarding his story on Holy Rosary beginnings.
