1. That Section 6 (General Provisions), Subsection 13  
(Parking Area Regulations) of By-law No. 31-69, as amended,  
is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof,  
the following new clause:  
Section 6(13) (j):  
(j) Notwithstanding paragraph (i) aforesaid, all required and  
accessory parking, except within a commercial (C1) general  
or industrial zone (M) shall be located within the same lot as  
the use for which the parking is provided.

2. This By-law will become effective on the date of passing  
thereof, subject to receiving the approval of the Ontario  
Municipal Board.

**Birds of Prey centre  
opens at Lion Safari**

A Canadian first goes to  
the African Lion Safari,  
the 500-acre drive-  
through wildlife park  
near Hamilton.

Lynne Stewart of Horn-  
by, a member of the  
park's public relations  
department, said a Birds  
of Prey Conservation  
Centre has recently been  
opened to the public at the  
park.

Eagles, rare falcons,  
owls and hawks are on  
display. A total of 33 birds  
inhabit the centre.

She and her partner,  
Bev McMullen, a gradu-  
ate of Sheridan College  
in Oakville, spend many  
hours lecturing on con-  
servation at schools, lib-  
raries and recreational  
centres.

Often, the talk includes  
bringing an animal or  
bird to the site to give  
the audience a chance to  
view the wildlife up close.

The centre is under the  
supervision of John Slay-  
ton of England, who has  
many years of experience  
in the field, according to  
G.D. Dailley, park gen-  
eral manager.

Mr. Slayton pointed out  
the differences between  
birds of prey.

"About two thirds of  
their number, the eagles,  
hawks, falcons and  
vultures, go about their  
business between sunrise  
and sunset. The rest, like  
owls, are nocturnal. Their  
huge binocular eyes have  
great light-gathering  
powers and their ears can  
pinpoint the rustling of a  
mouse in the darkest  
woods."

Mr. Dailley said the  
centre would also be  
concentrating on breed-  
ing rare and endangered  
falcons.

Explanatory Note

This By-law will amend the existing Restricted Area By-law  
of the Milton Planning Area, being the Zoning By-law of the  
Town of Milton, By-law No. 31-69, as amended.

By-law No. 31-69 presently does not provide adequate  
provisions for the development of parking lots.

By-law No. 42-79 proposes that all parking which is required  
to be provided pursuant to the parking provisions of By-law  
No. 31-69, except in the General Commercial "C1" and  
Industrial Areas, must be provided on the same lot or  
property as the use which requires the parking. This is to  
eliminate the creation of individual parking lots on vacant  
parcels of land.
