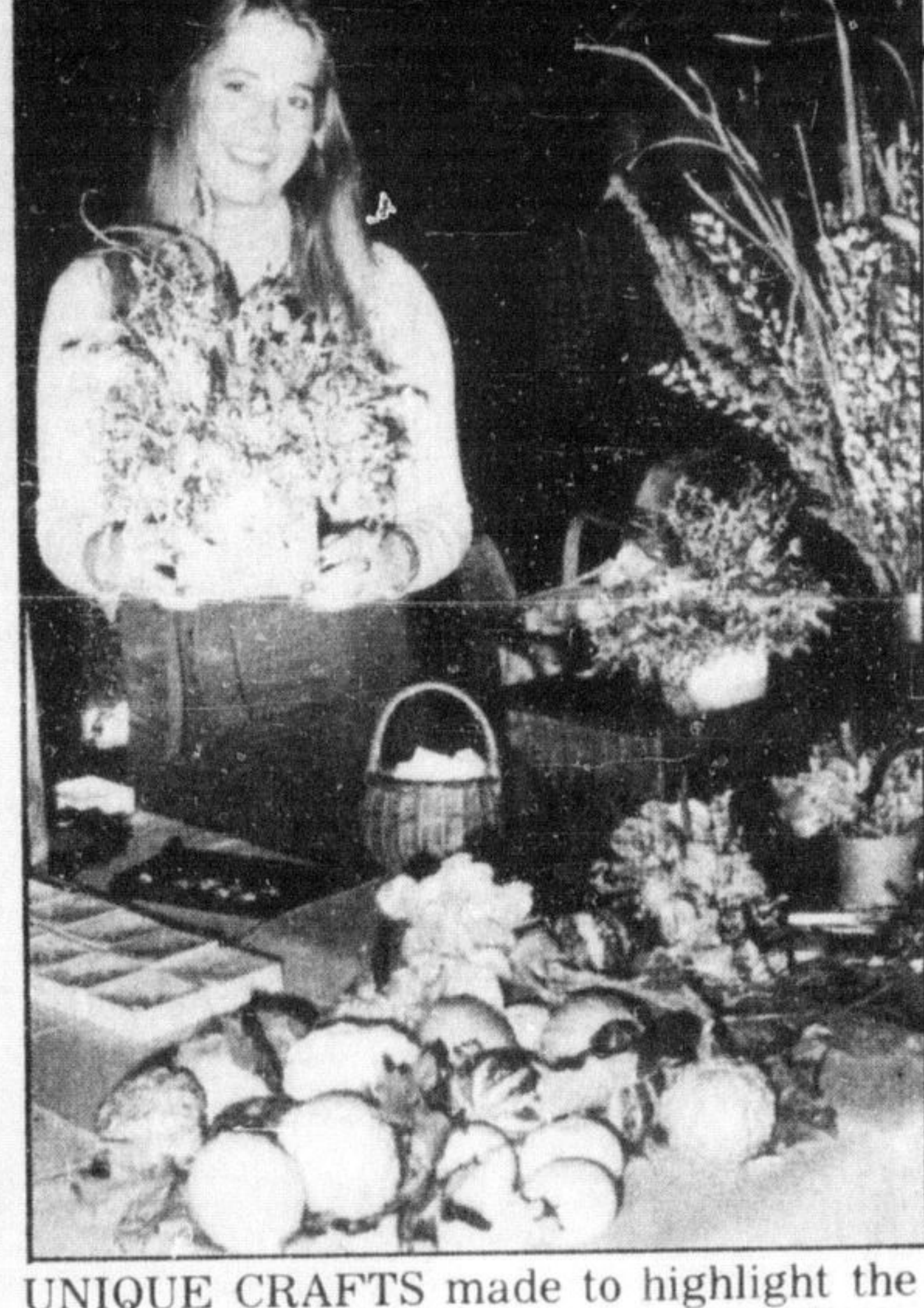




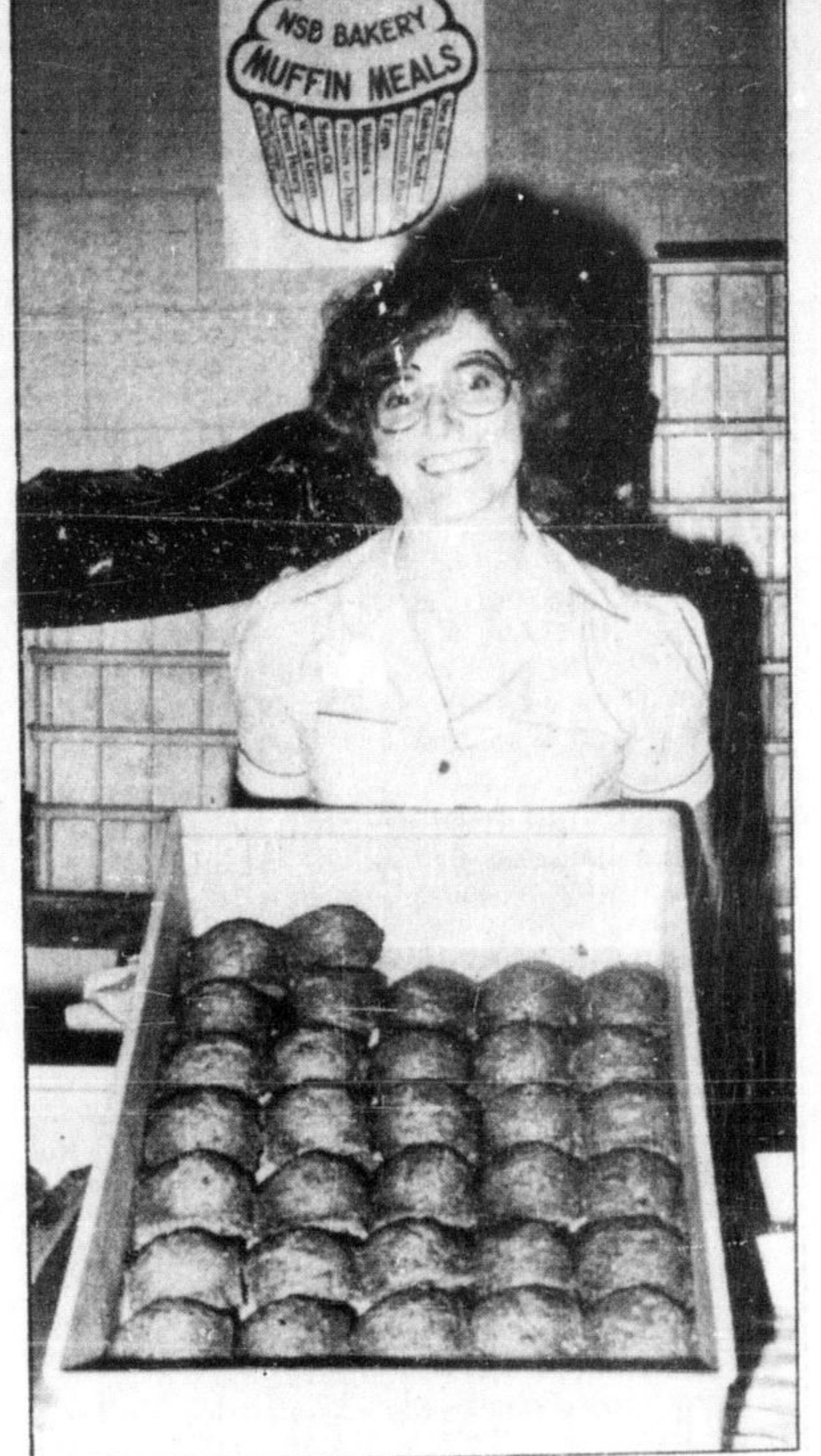

Country fair adds flavor to Ontario Week

If you like fall fairs with a dash of horse racing added, then Mohawk Raceway was the place for you on the weekend.

The race track was sponsoring Ontario Week from Friday to Tuesday and the object was to add a little autumn flavor to the six big stakes purses.

The big races were on Sunday as Bea Faber, considered the top woman harness driver in the United States, was on hand to pit herself against Canada's best in the \$50,000 Milton Pacing Stakes.

Over the weekend there were races totalling \$150,000 in purses with a \$20,000 handicap race on Friday

night. After the racing, the best part of Ontario Week was a country fair inside the track clubhouse in the eastern wing.

Here Mohawk had invited a number of exhibitors to set up booths and give race track patrons something to browse through.

Displays ran the gamut from apple pie vendors to crafts, wooden toys, hot muffins, and even a little area to test Ontario wines. The Ontario

government had two displays on agriculture. One of the outstanding display was a sort of Hall of Fame of the great horses which patrons of the raceway have watched over the years.

Among the horses in the Ontario Week display were Super Wave, Ambro Nador, and Smog. Despite rains and cold weather a spokesperson

for Mohawk Raceway said the attendance was good on Friday and Saturday evenings and they expected it to continue until closing of Ontario Week last night.

Manor report

Regional council has been told several renovations are planned for Halton Centennial Manor.

Councillor Walter Mulkewich of Burlington had asked Manor administrator Jack Charlton to report on four areas which the councillor felt were wanting.

The Province has recommended renovations to the kitchen with a new food preparation system to be phased in over a three-year period. Turning an old laundry

area into a crafts room is now under study and has received approval in principle.

The administrator said a review of the medical and nursing services at the manor are under review by a Ministry of Health nursing consultant.

A report on any deficiencies found is to be at committee in November.

There is also a plan to start interior decorating at the Manor
