Police recover stolen truck

A pick-up truck stolen from a Campbellville residence Sunday has been recovered by Halton Regional Police.

According to police the 1975 vehicle belonging to Garfield Jackson of Rf 3, Campbellville was discovered missing at 11:30 a.m. The truck had been left parked in the driveway with the keys in the vehicle.

Mr. Jackson told police he was awakened by dogs barking at 6:30 a.m. but he did not look to check if anything was wrong.

His brother, Grant Jackson, living next door, spotted the truck leaving. He presumed it was his brother going to work, said police.

The truck was discovered at noon on First Line with two smashed rear mirrors. Plywood valued at \$140 was also taken from the back of the truck.

Police are continuing their investigation.

Vandals hit Prothane

Cause \$20,000 damage

Vandals broke into Prothane Ltd. Monday morning and did \$20,000 damage in an apparent act of vandalism. Nothing was stolen.

Company president Warren Carter arrived in Milton from a holiday in Florida to find chemicals spilled onto the floor and over files.

"We feel it was knowledgeable, malicious damage," said Carter. "Somebody knew what was in here and they went right to the areas that would do the most damage."

Mr. Carter said Tuesday he will offer a \$500 reward to anyone providing information

leading to the apprehension of the culprits.

The vandals entered through a rear door, jimmying the door with a crowbar before going on a tear of destruction.

"There were five barrels of chemicals and the only two which don't evaporate were opened up."

As a result, the floor of his plant was covered in a thick resin. By determining the state of the resin, Carter pinpointed the approximate time of entry.

A thick chemical was poured on files and drawings. Oil and another chemical were dumped on the floor.

Carter said he felt the

knowledge of the vandals point towards a disgruntled ex-employee and has released a list of names to the police.

The company which manufactures polyurethane suffered one minor break-in 20 months ago. The company has been on Bronte St. in Milton for about two years.
