Roy Wood re-elected

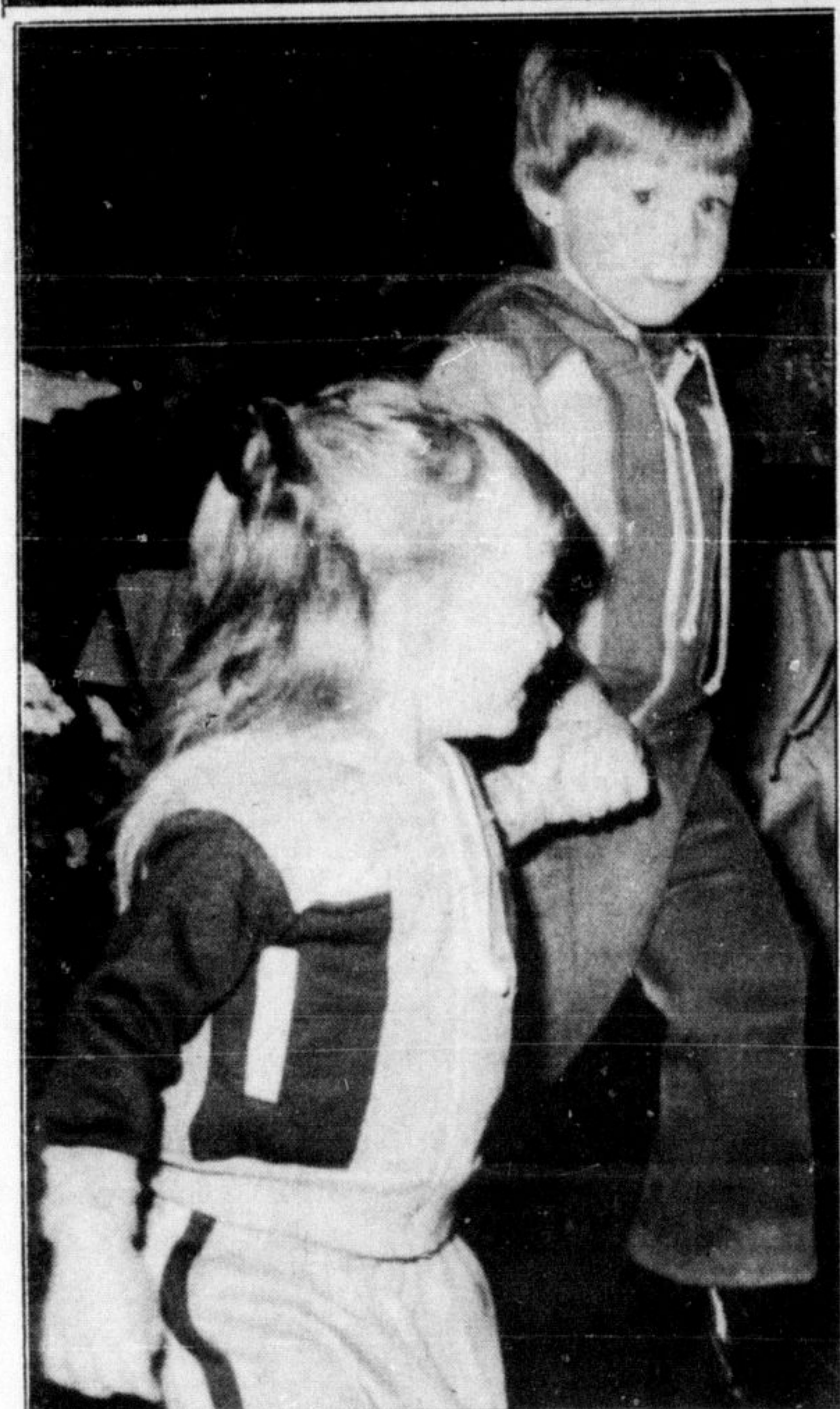
Roy Wood was re-elected president of the Halton-Burlington Provincial Progressive Conservative Association at the annual meeting in Brookville Hall earlier this month.
