In the horticultural section, class 4, five different flowers from the garden, winners were Mildred Menzies, Eva Chisholm, and Margaret Wrigglesworth. Mrs. Menzies' flowers were excellent specimens of gladiolus, rose, dahlia, chrysanthemum and begonia.

The winning flowering potted plant in class 5 was an African violet exhibited by Eva Chisholm. Runners-up were Margaret Wrigglesworth and Jean Robertson.

Class 7, three specimens of onion: Jean Robertson and Margaret Wrigglesworth. Class 8, three tomatoes: Jean Robertson.

The meeting was concluded with a lunch provided by Ada McCann and Jean Robertson.

Mr. McDowell pointed out the cash prizes won by students vary from a \$100 award to an \$8,000 scholarship (\$2,000 per year for four years).

Of the 342 graduates, 94 completed their fifth year (grade 13) of high school while 248 have graduated grade 12.

Mr. McDowell said there were no surprises in the numbers of grade 13 graduates as opposed to the number of grade 12 graduates. He said it is the continuation of a trend established a couple of years ago.

"There are a large number of students who leave school after grade 12. Most either go to work or they go to community college," he said.
