Family furnaces, like family cars, need special attention to perform efficiently and pollute as little as possible.

Proper maintenance and inspection of fur-Halton

Check your credit rating

Most people need to make use of credit at some time in their lives. When that time arrives, it's reassuring to know that everyone in Ontario, regardless of sex or marital status, has the right to apply for credit and be identical judged by standards.

But the use of credit is a privilege rather than a right. And before granting credit, credit-lending agencies will attempt to determine your credit worthiness, a measure of your promise and ability to repay the amount you borrow.

Although their criteria may vary slightly, most lending agencies, in looking for indications of stability and responsibility, will judge your credit worthiness according to certain basic considerations. You can avoid credit refusals by judging your own credit worthiness before you apply, and recongnizing those areas that may make you a poor credit

o Your character. Do you have a responsible attitude toward paying your bills? Have you shown responsibility in handling your finances in

the past?

o Your income and assets. Can you afford credit? Is your income steady? Do you own anything that is worth more than the amount you want to borrow?

o Your work record. How long have you been employed? How secure is your job?

o Your living ac-


commodations. Do you own or rent your living accommodations? How long have you lived at your current address?

o Your reasons for borrowing. Are you borrowing money as a necessary step toward fulfilling long-range goals or plans? Or are you borrowing to satisfy a whim?

Your application for credit may be turned down for any number of reasons. Lenders are not obliged to extend credit to anyone.

Of course, you may be able to obtain credit by shopping around. But if your application is turned down, take a (Continued on page 7)






