

Mustangs dealt losses in girls basketball

The senior girls basketball team of Milton District High School find themselves fighting for a playoff spot as a result of two losses last week in league play.

The Mustang seniors were dealt a 44-34 defeat by White Oaks Secondary School Thursday after Queen Elizabeth Park employed strong defence to win 27-16 Tuesday. Both games were at MDHS.

White Oaks carried a slim 34-21 lead into the

second half before out-scoring Milton 14-5 in the third quarter to salt away the win.

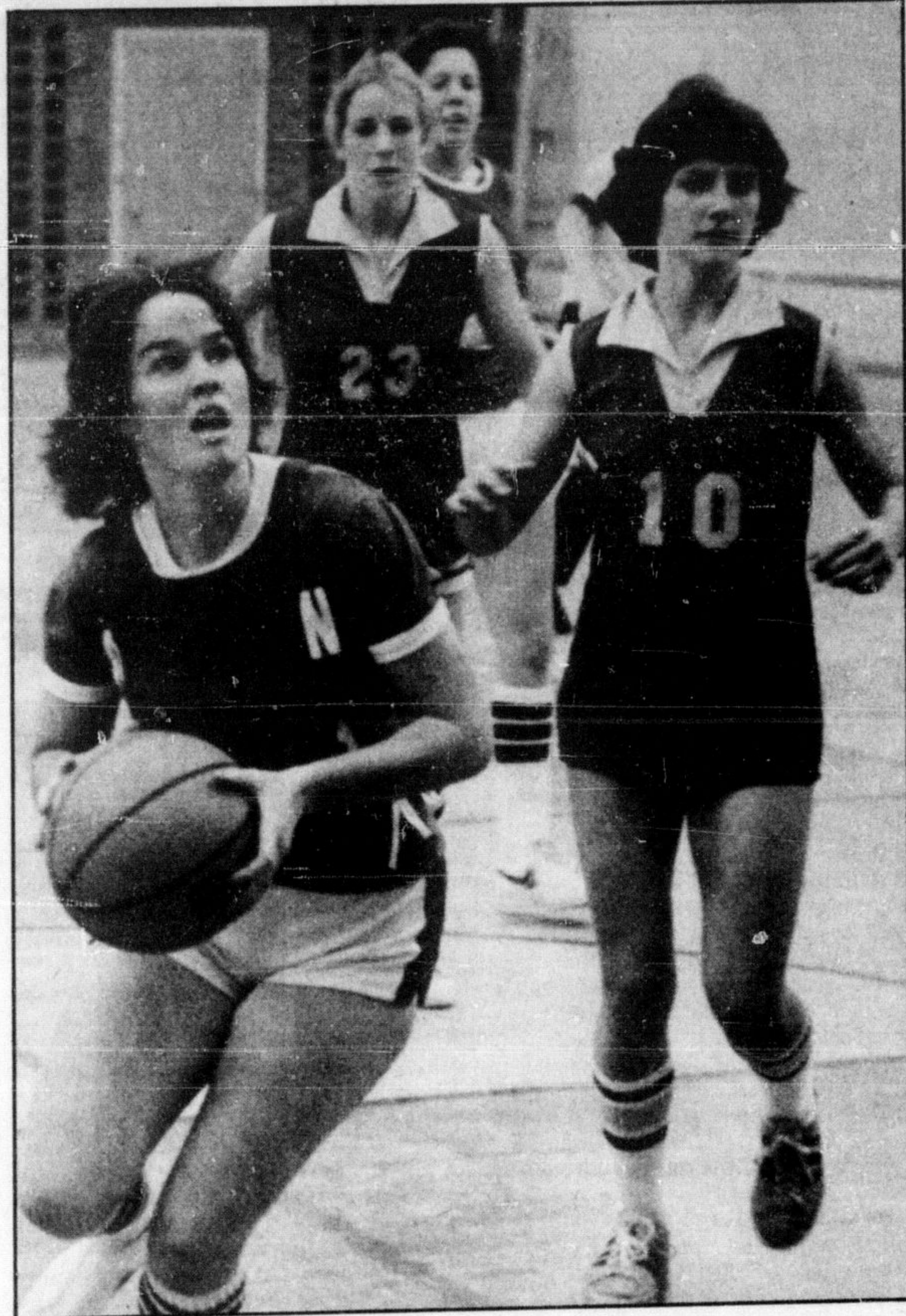
Joey Bennett was Milton's high scorer with 11 points followed by Patti Gies with 10 points.

The Milton seniors also suffered a third-quarter lapse against QEP being out-scored by a 13-2 margin after trailing 12-8 at the half. Milton held QEP to just two points in the final quarter but could not rally for the win.

Bennett counted for more than half Milton scoring with nine points.

Meanwhile in a junior confrontation, White Oaks edged Milton 24-21 with a fourth-quarter rally. Milton led 18-17 going into the final quarter but good defence held Milton to just three more points the rest of the game.

Julia Harrison, Darlene Phelps, Joanne Auger and Debbie Currie each scored four points for Milton.

Pollen's winning goal leads major atoms

Geoff Pollen scored the winning goal off a four-way passing play early in the third period to give Milton major atoms a 3-2 win over Streetsville Sunday in Streetsville.

The victory marked the first time this team had ever beaten their Streetsville rivals since the teams started playing one another at the novice level.

The win added icing onto the cake for the major atoms who had defeated Georgetown 7-2 Saturday at Memorial Arena.

Milton coach Dennis Buttrey was elated with

Against Georgetown, Milton ran up a 3-0 lead just 14 seconds into the second period before waiting to the victory.

Ellwood led Milton with a pair of goals with singles going to Wayne Rivers, Drennan, Pollen, Cole and Newby.

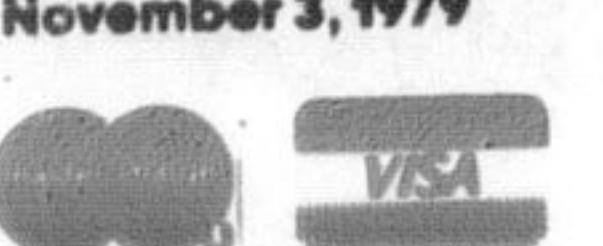
