

Juveniles rally for 9-2 victory

Kent Danforth and Scott Eves scored second-period goals to give Milton juveniles a 6-2 win over Georgetown Monday night at Memorial Arena.

It was a completely different team on the ice than the Milton squad which lost 9-3 Sunday night in Streetsville.

Against Georgetown, Milton forechecked well and controlled the play well to rack up the win.

The game took on a sour note when Milton's Jim Newman and Georgetown centre Steve Robbins became involved in an altercation with four minutes remaining in the game.

Newman was cut for several stitches in his forehead during the mishap by an errant skate from an official but charged after Robbins thinking Robbins had done the damage.

Milton's Greg Finn and Dan Tielsman harassed the officials after the game in the dressing room and were assessed major misconducts for their actions. Both will be suspended although the length hasn't yet been determined.

Streetsville scored seven goals in the first period to run Milton out of the rink. Streetsville also took the lion's share in the penalty department recording 18 minors, a major and a misconduct while Milton was saddled with 11 minors, a major and a misconduct.

Streetsville led 8-1 at one point. Wanless, Shannon and Danforth scored for Milton.
