Ford unveils T-bird

Trafalgar Motors Co. Ltd., recently unveiled the new 1980 Thunderbird. The car has been downsized for the second time. Seven hundred pounds and 15 inches have been shaved off.

Last year Ford introduced its new Mustang and sales jumped 50 per cent. A variety of options and European styling were partly responsible. These traits can be seen in the Thunderbird.

Ford of Canada vice-president of sales Ken-

neth Harrigan expects the sales increase started by Mustang will be picked up in the mid-sized range with the Thunderbird.

It comes standard with a 4.2 litre V8 and an option is the four-speed automatic overdrive transmission.

Other options are intriguing. There is a five-button, 10-number panel on the door which can be pre-programmed with a series of digits only the owner knows. This computer door lock is not the

only electronic wizardry being offered.

There is a digital read-out speedometer which constantly informs the driver of the exact speed.

Trafalgar Motors sales manager Larry Middleton notes the "F" series of light pick-up trucks is one of the company's top sellers and he expects the trend to remain unchanged.

New comfort, convenience and appearance options plus refined engineering highlight the new line of Chrysler Canada cars at Milton Chrysler-Dodge.

Heinz Vogel, president, has the re-styled and downsized Cordoba in the showroom along with the elegant Diplomat. Both are complimented in the mid-sized range by the new Mirada.

The top of the line New Yorker Fifth Avenue is offered in two versions this year and comes with a list of options.

Chrysler has a lot riding on its new entire line for 1980 and Mr. Vogel stressed the statements of Chrysler chairman Lee Iacocca that new car buyers owe it to themselves to compare what Chrysler offers for the dollar, compared to the other automakers.

The Dodge Omni, the company's efficiency car, has received refined engineering and new comfort and convenience options for 1980.

There's also a sporty new European-type option package for the Omni 024.

Omni continues its sales success from last year and has added a five-door hatchback and sports-oriented three-door 024.

Both models come with a 1.7 litre four-cylinder engine designed to use regular fuel because of Chrysler's electronic ignition system.

New for 1980 is the De Tomaso option package on the 024 which comes in red or yellow body color.

There's also a good selection of "new" 1979 models at prices worth investigating.

says the light truck has become the best-selling vehicle in Canada. Harrigan does not believe the downturn in light truck sales in the United States will occur in Canada.

1980 models excite

Gallinger Motors Ltd. held its official introduction of the Lincoln Mercury line of cars Thursday, Oct. 11.

Sales manager Gary Neilson said he already has more than 30 sold orders for the new series of downsized Lincolns.

"Response has exceeded what we had hoped.

"The new XR-7 Cougar and the Lincolns have been really bringing people in to see us," he said.

The Cougar is the Lincoln-Mercury counterpart of the new Thunderbird, and it is aimed specifically at the 29 per cent of Canadians who buy cars in the mid-sized range.

The Cougar is 16 inches shorter than last year's XR-7 and that was a car downsized from Ford's first round of making cars smaller and more efficient.

The car also comes standard with a 255-cubic inch V-8 engine, the

smallest produced in North America. This can be had with a new automatic four-speed overdrive transmission.

In addition to the Capri line, Gallinger has the Lincoln Continental, which has been downsized and is complemented by the new Mark VI.

The cars are also 800 pounds lighter than the 1979 cars they replace. The slippery styling is said to represent a 21 per cent increase in fuel economy.
