

# Number One is No. 1 in contests

The Number One company of Milton Fire Department is still "No. 1" following the conclusion of an in-house competition in hose lays and pumping.

No. 1 Co. edged out No. 4 by an average of less than six seconds to claim the title Friday, Oct. 19. The four-part contest involving all six fire companies had been going on all summer.

Fire Chief Jim Coulson said the hose lays and pumping practice are part of the regular training program, but the competitive aspect was added this year to create more interest. Competition was fierce at times, with a lot of good-natured kidding thrown in as the teams vied for the fastest time.

Contests included pumping water from a hydrant with a pumper, drafting from an in-ground water tank, using the portable pump from the tanker, and pumping with the brigade's snorkel truck. "We touched every base of what they might have to do in a fire situation," said the Chief.

Final average times were: Co. 1, 76.45 seconds; Co. 2, 102.62; Co. 3, 97.65; Co. 4, 85.25; Campbellville Co. 1, 107; Campbellville Co. 2, 116. A morning practice session is also held for men who are on afternoon shifts, and this group logged a time of 106.25 seconds.

Chief Coulson said the times were high for the Campbellville sub-station crew as they were using Milton's trucks instead of their own. They also had to battle a fierce headwind. The morning crew's time was high because they did not have the advantage of watching other crews compete, thereby learning from others' mistakes.

All the tests were held at the rear of the fire hall on Steeles Ave., where a metal waterball is suspended on a 100 foot long steel cable. After setting up the hoses and drawing the water, the crews had to force the cable with a single hose line.

Members of the winning No. 1 crew were Acting Captain Larry McDougall, Harold Penson, Irish Coulson, Ron Gervais, Keith Bundy, Lyle Wallis, Al Jones, Bill Russell and Tony Villa.
