Fifth Wheelers stalled 4-2

Milton Fifth Wheel major bantams split two games over the weekend losing to previously winless Guelph Saturday 4-2 and beating Oakville at home 3-2 Sunday.

In the Guelph game, Fifth Wheelers failed to get untracked in the first period with Guelph completely outplaying them. The period ended in a 1-1 tie with Marty Reid

scoring for Guelph and Bob Landry replying for Milton.

Guelph goalie Rod Meron foiled numerous good scoring chances the Fifth Wheelers had in the second period and Guelph's Brian Smith scored the period's lone goal.

In the third period Guelph's Brad Fagan

and Dave Bean netted markers for the home team before Milton's Rob McCullough closed out the game's scoring.

At home Sunday, the Fifth Wheelers played a much more disciplined brand of hockey. However, again they came up against another hot goaltender in the person of Glen Grandy

for Oakville. The first period was scoreless with no penalties. Milton's Landry scored the game's first goal with only three minutes remaining in the second period before Oakville's Sean Cleary tied the game before the period ended.

Oakville's Marty Raus shot his team into a 2-1 lead on a power-play during the first minute of play in the third period.

At the eight minute mark of the third period, John Turner tied the game at two on a five effort after Milton's goalie had been pulled in favour of an extra attacker. Milton's Rick Brown fired the game-winning goal with one minute remaining.

The Fifth Wheelers appear to have entered a scoring slump and although they are outshooting the opposition, are not making their shots count.

Coach Gary Hudson hopes his shooters get their shots back on target before the weekend when they travel to Dundas to compete in the first annual Dundas Bantam tournament.

Milton slipped by Oakville narrowly 2-0. Paul Rowan and Pollen scored in the second and third periods respectively to chalk up the win.
