Grant Haulage minor bantams completed one of their most successful weeks of the season, winning two league games and one exhibition contest.

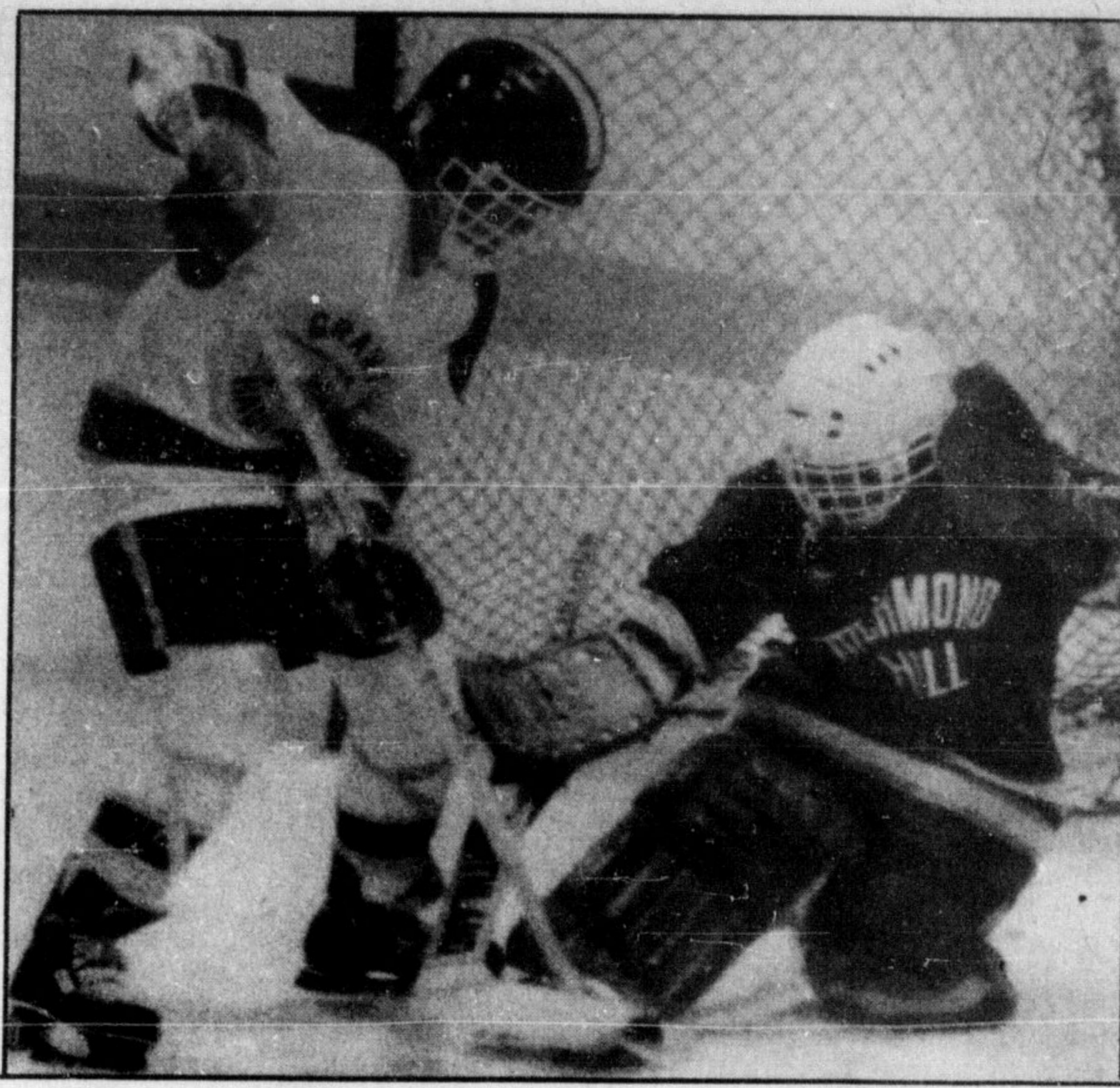
Sunday night in Brampton, the truckers got off to a good start, scoring twice before the home club woke up and evened the score early in the third period. Howie Scannell broke the tie

Serafini scored earlier on a brilliant solo effort and Terry Ellwood got the other in the 4-2 Milton victory. Billy Blyth coming back from a brief holiday, played his best game of the season but was robbed twice by the Brampton goaltender.

Monday night in Milton, the bants fired eight goals past the shell-shocked Ancaster goaltender.

Haskett again led the way with a hatrick; Jeff Sanford with his patented backhand, Graeme Hicken from a nice set up by Haskett, Serafini, Chris Cormier and Mike Berry with a blistering wrist-shot rounded out the scoring. Saliba again performed solidly in the nets. The win brings the truckers record to 10-3.
