This service would be purchased from the Milton Branch of the Canadian Red Cross.



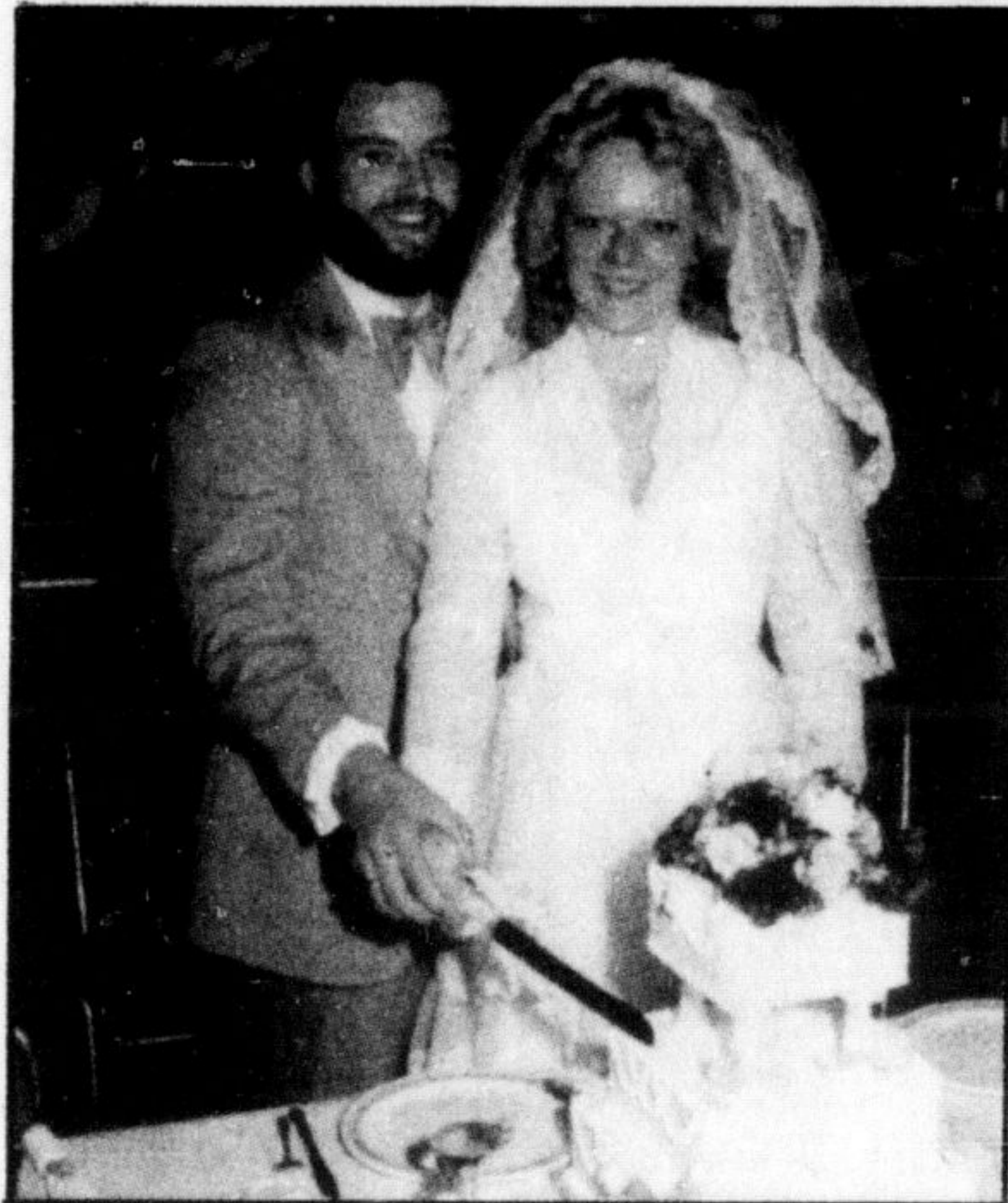
