## Willard Britton

A well known World War I veteran, Willard David Britton, R.R. 4, Acton, died December 8 in Georgetown District Hospital following a lengthy illness.  
 Mr. Britton was born in Nassagaweya township September 20, 1895, son of Edward and Sarah Britton. He attended SS No. 7 Nassagaweya school, and served in WWI from 1916 to 1918.  
 On November 26, 1924 he married Mary Job in Nassagaweya township. They lived at R.R. 4, Acton for 52 years.  
 Mr. Britton was a farmer, and an R.R. 1, Acton rural mail carrier for 24 years. He was a

charter member of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 197, Acton, was a school trustee with the Dublin School Section, was on the Acton Milk Producers, and the Golden Age Club. He was also a member of the Knox Presbyterian Church for 52 years.  
 He was an active Legion member and an avid euchre player.

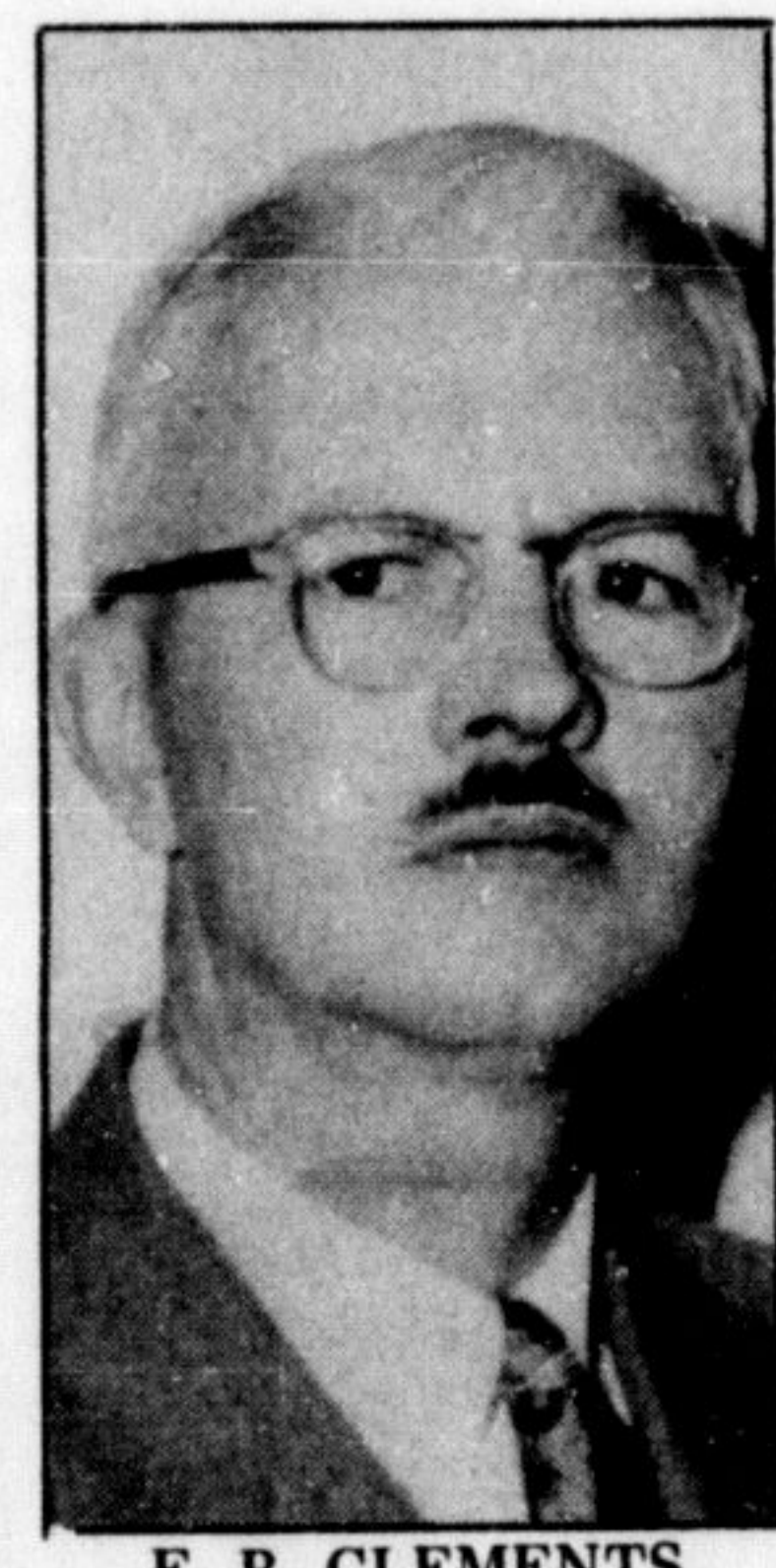
Boynon, Mississauga, Verna Mullen, Campbellville, and Letetia Herd, North Cobalt.

## E. Bradford Clements

Highly respected as a business leader and community worker, E. Bradford Clements of Appleby Line, RR 6 Milton passed away at Milton District Hospital on Friday, Dec. 21, 1979. He was 68 and had been ill for about 10 months.  
 A lifelong resident of Milton and district, Mr. Clements was born April 5, 1911, the son of W. Bradford Clements and Bertha (Deacon) Clements. He attended local schools and graduated from University of Toronto in 1934, then farmed until the mid-1950s after starting an insurance agency office in Milton in 1954. The agency became known as Clements and Noble Insurance Agency in 1969 and he retired from the business in 1971.  
 From 1939 to 1947 he farmed at the north-west corner of Derry Rd. and Guelph Line, and from 1947 to the mid-1950s he farmed on Derry Rd. west of Appleby Line, below Rattlesnake Point.  
 He also operated the properties his father had owned in downtown Milton, including the Clements Block at the north-west corner of Main and Martin Sts., from 1946 to 1972 when it was formed into a family company now known as Gen Three Ltd.  
 His community work encompassed many organizations. He was a trustee on Nelson Township School Board in the early 1950s and he was treasurer of Milton District Hospital Board from 1956 to 1959 and a director 1964 to 1968.

Mr. Clements established and received certification for growing a Canadian variety of English Boxwood, now known and sold as Clembrook Boxwood. The Clembrook name is from his farm name.  
 He was also a member of the senior citizens club, horticultural society and historical society.  
 He was active in St. Paul's United Church as an elder, member of the board of stewards, the unified board and the choir. He was treasurer of the Christian Education Centre building fund from 1960 to 1975.  
 In 1938 he married Margaret R. Jenkinson of Prescott, who died in 1971. They had four children, G. Bradford of RR 2 Milton, Mrs. Gord (Jane) Hasselfeldt of RR 6 Milton, Donald F. Clements of Mississauga and Michael W. J. Clements of RR 6 Milton.  
 Also surviving are two sisters Mrs. Wes (Frances) Thompson of Oakville and Mrs. Alan (Marion) Crawford of Clarkson, and nine grandchildren.  
 In August of 1978 he married Marie Russell of Toronto.  
 Rev. E. T. Jack Birch of St. Paul's conducted the funeral service at the church on Dec. 24, with the church choir leading in the singing. Interment followed at Evergreen Cemetery, Milton.  
 Pallbearers were friends Mike Ledwith, Charles Thomson, Don Hayward, Roy Noble, Peter Crawford and Robert Thompson.
