

New post office promised for this year - Otto Jelinek

Milton will have a new post office by the end of this year, Halton MP Otto Jelinek said Saturday. Mr. Jelinek quoted a

letter from Erik Nielsen, Minister of Public Works, saying ground will be broken this spring and construction would be

completed in November. Mr. Jelinek made the announcement during the official opening of his Milton campaign office in

Milton Mall. He paid tribute to Milton Mayor Don Gordon and gave him most of the credit for the post office.

to be built at the corner of Brown and Mary Sts. across from the old court house and jail. Combining the an-

ouncement with a campaign speech, Mr. Jelinek said he sympathized with the frustration Mr. Gordon must have felt in

his dealings with the government of former Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau.

Mr. Jelinek said the need for a post office in Milton was established years ago under the Trudeau government.

"But they (the Liberals) didn't do anything about it. All they did was study it."

"No action. Instead, your tax dollars were loaned to Communist countries like Cuba and China."

He said the Progressive Conservative government's budget had cut a large number of "wasteful grants and loans" and was "the first step to reduce inflation."

NDP pins hope on north Halton

Milton and Acton will play a significant part in electing "the first NDP MP from Halton" according to NDP candidate Doug Black.

Mr. Black officially opened his Milton-area committee room Saturday in the Milton Mall and he praised the help the party had received in the last election and said he expects it to continue.

He said the campaign office was put into operation last Thursday with just a few workers on hand to help pin up signs and clean, "but within about an hour we had seven people - new

people - come in and volunteer their services."

Mr. Black said "with that kind of support, I know Milton and Acton will be in the forefront of us getting the required number of votes to go over the top in 1980 and send our first NDP MP from Halton."

The 1980 winter election is seen by Mr. Black as an advantage for the New Democratic Party.

"In the 1979 election, it had been five years since the issues had been brought out, so we had to spend a lot of time building confidence."

Future meetings useless - Jelinek

Future all-candidate meetings in the Halton riding could be a waste of time, according to PC candidate Otto Jelinek, if his Liberal opponent Bill Perras fails to supply some party policies.

Mr. Jelinek said he is issuing a challenge to the

candidate to come up with "some policies - any policies."

He said the first public meeting held Sunday "didn't have the meat as it should have," because the Liberals "are unable to discuss their policies which they don't have."

Crosbie here Feb. 5

Federal Finance Minister John Crosbie is coming to town Tuesday, February 5.

The announcement was made Monday afternoon at a press conference called by Halton PC candidate Otto Jelinek.

According to Mr. Jelinek, the minister will arrive in Oakville Tuesday evening via Acton and Milton.

Details of the visit remain to be finalized, but plans call for Mr. Crosbie to speak at a rally at Blakelock High School that evening.

Sixth enters race

A sixth candidate has been nominated in Halton. Charles Shrybman, a

Marxist-Leninist, is running in the Feb. 18 federal election in Halton.

Mr. Shrybman also ran in the May 22, 1979 election, finishing sixth out of six candidates.

With a small brush, rub French chalk into dull spots left on rugs by furniture pressure. Let stand 30 minutes, then vacuum.
