

Man honored for a brave deed



A HAPPY GORDON SCOTT was pleasantly surprised recently when Brampton honored the Milton man for bravery for rescuing a man from a house fire. Sharing a special moment is his wife, Linda.

Gordon Scott of Milton doesn't regard himself as a hero. In fact, the 32-year-old father of two was quite surprised when he received an invitation to the annual Citizens' Civic Awards ceremony in Brampton recently.

But the town's fire and police departments were not about to let him forget his help. Mr. Scott along with James Baudry of Brampton were awarded a plaque for bravery for entering a burning house on Steeles Ave. last February and dragging a victim to safety through smoke and flames.

Despite attempts to revive the victim, he later died on arrival at Peel Memorial Hospital. Mr. Scott remembers well the evening. He was travelling with his brother-in-law, Doug Steele to a meeting of the First Baptist Church in Brampton.

Smoke was curling from the rooftop of a Steeles Ave. house as he passed by and he immediately stopped. The house was dark

and showed little sign of life, he recalled. There were no flames, but he ran next door to call for the fire department. A second motorist had stopped now and James Baudry joined the two men for a search of the house. When the trio arrived at the rear of the house, they were met with

billowing smoke. The back door was opened and little could be seen except for an orange glow rising from a rear stairway. A window popped from the heat of the fire and the three men rushed to the front of the house. Neighbours had told Mr. Scott an elderly man lived alone in the house.

Certain that the man was still inside, Mr. Scott was now determined to get inside. A wall of flames greeted them as the front door was pryed open. James Baudry crept in, but within a few seconds, overcome with smoke, he was forced out. On his hands and

knees, with eyes closed, Mr. Scott began crawling through the . He was sure he had spotted a form on the floor when the door had been first opened. He found the man unconscious, lying behind a door.

He grabbed the man by his belt and began his return to the front door, where Doug Steele was

still managing to hold the door ajar. By now, the blaze had drawn many to the residence and once outside on the lawn, attempts were made to revive the unconscious man. He never regained consciousness. "I was very surprised at the award. I had never given it any more

thought," he said of the rescue. He found accepting the plaque "more scarier than the deed," said the Ontario sales manager for Arrow Fasteners. He and his wife, Linda have resided on Willow Ave. for the past seven years with their two children, Stephen, eight and Janet, four.
